


Michigan State's Water Carnival draws spectators from distant places to see the beautiful and unusual float displays. Gamma Phi Beta took

second place this spring with this float titled "Disneyland."



Preceding the formal opening banquet, a reception was held in the Garden Terrace honoring Grand Council and honored guests. ## DAY BY DAY AT CONVENTION

July 2, 1956

RRIVING at the Greenbrier early Monday morning, delegates welcomed the hot coffee served in the lower lobby as they waited to register. Whisked off to their lovely rooms (there are 600 rooms at the Greenbrier, each decorated differently under the expert hand of Dorothy Draper), there was time to unpack, freshen up and enjoy a leisurely breakfast before the Province meetings at 11:30.

Luncheon was hostessed by the Ames and Des Moines alumnæ chapters, with an "Iowa State Fair" theme. Each guest received a prize ribbon of gold, red, white, green or purple, and matched her ribbon to the centerpiece. The head table featured a cornucopia filled with Iowa field corn, while individual places were marked with small feed troughs filled with candy corn. Arline Wiegand Nelson of Des Moines was chairman of the luncheon while guests were welcomed by Gwen Riggs of Des Moines and Amber Stow of Ames.

The first general session convened at 2:00 P.M., with Grand President Elizabeth Fee Arnold presiding. Following roll call, delegates were welcomed by Delphine Johnston Andrews, Convention Marshal. Convention committee appointments were approved, and officers were introduced, after which Mrs. Arnold presented her Grand President's message. An informal discussion of Revisions of the Constitution, By-Law and Standing Rules followed the formal session.

Monday evening's formal reception honoring Grand Council and Honored Guests preceded the formal opening banquet, arranged by Gamma chapter and Madison and Milwaukee alumnæ chapters. Carla Nolting Smith served as toastmistress and introduced Lora Lee Pederson, Director of the School of Social Work at the University of Texas, who spoke on "The Mark of a Gamma Phi."

July 3

A school on Parliamentary Procedure was held each morning at 8:15 under the direction of Mrs. W. Glenn Suthers, Parliamentarian. The general session following was devoted to a presentation of the Proposed Revisions, by Marion Bebb Howe, chairman of the Revisions Committee.

"From the Land of the Pennsylvania Dutch" was the luncheon theme, arranged by the Philadelphia alumnæ chapter with Marion Doty Bickford as official hostess. Table decorations included red barn centerpieces and red and yellow tulips in black pots decorated with Pennsylvania Dutch motifs. The lucky number at each table allowed its owner to take the centerpiece home.

Kappa chapter and Minneapolis-St. Paul alumnæ were hostesses for the formal banquet at 7:30 which honored International Committee Chairmen and Province Officers. Utilizing a Paul Bunyan theme, the hostesses brought a life size statue of Paul, made of Styrofoam, along with smaller replicas of Paul and Babe, the blue ox, for table centerpieces. In the program dedication to the Big Wheels, we read, "Paul Bunyan was so large he used big wheels from a wagon as buttons on his shirt. Gamma Phi also needs big wheels to hold its large organization together. We salute our Big Wheels!"

A model initiation, under the direction of Rosemary Sundberg, International Chairman of Ritual, was held at 9:00 P.M., presented by Omega chapter. Honor initiate was Mary Ann Pahl of Beta chapter, who received her pin from Grand President Elizabeth Arnold.

July 4

It hardly felt like a holiday, as delegates met in general session to vote on revisions and hear a report on our Philanthropies by Grace Merrill, president of the Philanthropy Board. Fay Davis Deupree, International Chairman of Expansion also reported that two Greek letter chapters were installed during the biennium, Beta Sigma at Washington State and Beta Tau at Texas Tech.

A beautiful buffet luncheon was served at the Golf and Tennis Club, followed by a free afternoon which found Gamma Phis playing tennis and golf, swimming, horseback riding and sight-seeing around the beautiful hotel grounds.

At five o'clock, the traditional Memorial Service was held at St. Thomas Church in White Sulphur Springs, under the direction of Rosemary Sundberg, assisted by Helen Bush Mills. Alpha Chi chapter presented the readings and choral singing.

Holiday spirits burst forth at the informal "Firecracker Bust" dinner, sponsored by Alpha Delta, Phi and St. Louis chapters. July 5



HIRTEEN is the lucky number for Nu Chapter of Gamma Phi Beta. It was the thirteenth chapter of Gamma Phi; the first chapter house was located on Thirteenth Street, and it had thirteen members at the time of its installation.

The history of Nu Chapter is linked closely with that of the University of Oregon in Eugene, Oregon, where it is located. It was in April, 1904, when six girls formed the first local sorority, Tau Pi, at the University. The girls then became acquainted with Gamma Phi Beta alumnæ and soon presented a petition to Gamma Phi. The six girls were Miss Mary Gray, Mrs. Caroline Benson Unander, Mrs. Olen (Helen McKinney) Arnspiger, Mrs. O. F. (Leila Straub) Stafford, Mrs. Jean Gray Powell, and Miss Bertha McKinney.

To continue its "firsts," Tau Pi became Nu Chapter of Gamma Phi Beta, the first national sorority on the Oregon campus. Lambda Chapter from the University of Washington installed Nu on December 18, 1908. The president of the University, Prince Lucien Campbell, recognized Nu Chapter as a successful experiment in cooperative living and an excellent means of improving housing facilities for women on the campus. To further growth and interest in Nu Chapter in the memorable year of 1908, the girls often entertained the faculty, consisting of twenty professors. The student body then consisted of 300 students.

From its first house on Thirteenth Street, the chapter moved to a new house on the corner of Alder and Thirteenth, just a few blocks from what was then the center of the campus. Finally in 1925, the chapter moved to its present location along the banks of the historic Millrace.

The University was actually founded 32 years before the founding of Nu Chapter, in 1876. J. W. Johnson from Yale College was the first president, and Deady Hall was the only building on the campus. Deady still stands with the original stone walls as sturdy as ever, but the inside was recently completely remodeled. Financial difficulty almost closed the doors of the University during those early years, but Henry Villard came to its aid by paying the building debt and contributing money for library books. In 1886, the second building, Villard Hall, was erected, and in the following years, the University campus has rapidly expanded. It now has some 25 buildings and a present enrollment of over 5,000 students.

It is a well-rounded university, consisting of many departments and schools, and offers a complete range of courses in liberal arts, architecture and allied arts, business administration, pre-medicine, education, health and physical education, journalism, law, music, and includes the medical school located at Portland

Oregon Gamma Phi Betas of 1956 proudly look back upon both the history of the University and of Nu Chapter. Just a look around the spacious, green-lawned campus and its buildings tells a story of particular interest to Gamma Phis.

John Straub Hall, a men's dormitory (although during World War II, women inhabited its masculine halls, and still have lived in some sections of it during recent years), was named after the first Dean of Men who served 32 years in this position. He was the father of Leila Straub Stafford, one of the founders of Nu Chapter. Mrs. Stafford, a resident of Eugene, living just off the campus, is still an active alumna of Nu Chapter and the University.

In 1950, the Erb Memorial Student Union was opened and dedicated to the memory of the late University president and professor, Donald Erb. He was the husband of a Gamma Phi. Mrs. Erb is a member of the Eugene alumnæ chapter, and his two daughters, Mrs. John (Barbara) Craig and Mrs. Frank (Betsy) Bliss are both members of Nu Chapter.

Earl Hall, a new men's dormitory was completed and opened in the fall of 1955. It is named after Virgil Earl, director of athletics and Dean of Men in 1931. He was the father of Mary E. Earl Maltman, also a member of Nu Chapter. Stafford unit, a section of Earl Hall, is named after O. F. Stafford, the late husband of Mrs. Leila Stafford.

The calendar of events throughout the school year at Oregon has grown with the school. Fall term is highlighted by Homecoming Weekend, and Oregon Gamma Phis actively participate in the Noise Parade, attend the football game, the Homecoming Dance, and entertain at open house for the weekend. Winter term ushers in house dances, Dad's Day, the Military Ball, and the Senior Ball.

Taking the spotlight Spring term are two big weekends, including Duck Preview when high school seniors visit the campus, and house dances. The big highlight of the year is Junior Weekend, during which all houses partake in the All-Campus Sing, the Junior Prom, All-Campus Luncheons, and the Canoe Fete, a float parade on the old Millrace. The Pauline Potter Homer Tea is held just before graduation each year in honor of alumnæ graduating seniors. This tea is held in memory of Pauline Potter Homer, a Gamma Phi of Nu Chapter who took active interest in the literary field.

Each year the outstanding senior is selected by the girls in the house and her name is engraved on a recognition plaque. The plaque is named for and contains the Tau Pi pin of Leila Stafford.

The French Provincial style is carried out by the round pink marble coffee table and crystal chandelier.


The wall to wall pink carpeting flows across the entrance hall, past the open stairway, and on into the comfortable living room. All eyes immediately perceive the decorative pink clock above the mantel of sprayed green brick. The clock face itself is framed by a flowery design of gold flecked pink leaves

and vines. In front of the mantel are a pair of soft comfortable love seats, with pink lamps on the end tables. Between the love seats is a pink marble coffee table. One corner of the living room has a pink rough textured sectional divan with a low corner table. There are two lounge chairs which match the upholstery of the couch in the sunroom.

The green walls of the living room are repeated in the sun room at the front of the house. Lighting is controlled through the use of loosely woven draperies of gray-green and pale green. These draperies diffuse the day light from all the windows in the living room and the sun room. In one corner of the sun room there is a comfortable pink divan with a print of big green coins as the motif. In another corner there is a permanent card table, Also in the sun room is the newly acquired 24 inch television set.




BEFORE . . . looking toward the sun room, and after, at right, where deft handling of color and furniture selection and placement achieves a feeling of spaciousness.

These are reflected in a large mirror which extends from the top of the buffet to near the ceiling. The loosely woven green draperies are repeated.

At the top of the open stairway is the town girls room, which is decorated in the same style and color scheme as described in the room of the lower floor. There are four bedrooms and two baths on the second floor, a pink powder room, and a dorm which sleeps sixteen girls. There are four bedrooms and



a bath on the third floor.







By October 1, unless otherwise notified, send Grand President business for consideration at fall council meeting.

By October 1, alumnæ chapter letters for December CRESCENT, including vital statistics and glossies due Mrs. T. R. Naglestad, Rock Rapids, Iowa. At the end of each chapter letter include name and telephone number of member in your chapter whom alumnæ new in the community may call.

By January 1, send to Central Office Alumnæ Chapter Payment Report covering camp and alumnæ taxes, annual dues, and life subscription and life membership payments. These payments may be made any time during the fiscal year, August 1 through July 31; however, chapters are considered delinquent if partial payments are not paid by January 1.

By January 10, feature articles, glossies and newspaper clippings for March CRESCENT due Editor-in-chief, Mrs. Marek.

By February 20, alumnæ chapter letters for May CRESCENT, including glossies and vital statistics due Mrs. Naglestad.

By February 15, send 2 copies of the Alumnæ Chapter President's Report to the Alumnæ Vice-President.

By February 25, send Grand President business for consideration at spring council meeting.

Not later than March 25, send name and address of member responsible for rushing recommendations during the summer to Central Office.

By July 1, features and glossies for September CRESCENT due Editorin-chief, Mrs. Marek.
