


The Lighter Side Of College Life

... and the children sent a message

"Congratulations, congratulations, congratulations! Drop in and see us when you're in town," read the telegram from a trio of proud children to their mother, Gamma Phi Beta Marilyn Marshall Mitchell, minutes after she was crowned "Mrs. America of 1963" at Miami Beach on April 27.

To a native Californian who had never been outside the borders of her own state, 1963-64 will find her making public appearances all over the United States representing the American homemaker.

Marilyn attended San Diego State College and was initiated into the Beta Lambda chapter of Gamma Phi Beta in 1949. While on campus she was a speech arts major and participated in Little Theater activities.

Since leaving college, Marilyn has been active in the San Diego alumnae chapter of Gamma Phi Beta. She has modeled in the annual alumnae fashion show for the last two years. Marilyn's precedent for alumnae participation was established by her aunt, Mrs. Raymond Houston (Marjorie Davidson), who long has been active in the Glendale, Calif. alumnae chapter of Gamma Phi Beta.

The San Diego Junior Woman's Club, of which Marilyn has been a member for the past 13 years and is a past president, nominated the new "Mrs. America" and insisted that she compete. On the basis of questionnaires, essays, recipes, photographs, and an interview, Marilyn won the California title. Fifty-one women, representing each state and the District of Columbia, were adjudged for a week at Miami Beach on homemaking ability, personality, charm, poise, good grooming, stage presence and community interests and activities.

Lyle Mitchell, "Mrs. America's" husband, is Marketing Personnel Supervisor with the Pacific Telephone Company. They have three children, daughters Shelley, 11, and Rondey, 10, and a son, Kirk, 9. Mrs. Mitchell has been active in the P.T.A. for seven years and she also belongs to the great fraternity of Little League mothers.

Since her coronation in April, Marilyn Mitchell has been a special guest at the Kentucky Derby, toured New York City, appeared at conventions, children's hospitals and veteran's hospitals, and modeled a \$150,000 diamond and emerald necklace for Nieman-Marcus in Dallas. One novel honor came to her on June 4 when a special recess was called in the California State Senate in order to introduce "Mrs. America" to the members. She received a special Senate Resolution of commendation.

Admittedly no shining light in athletics, Marilyn recalls being named "Mrs. Mission Valley Tennis Club" in 1962. Her handprint is now preserved in cement along with Maureen Connolly Brinker, famed U.S. tennis star. Marilyn's slight embarrassment at this stems from her being a non-tennis player!

The year ahead will be a busy one for Marilyn. She has schedules to appear in Houston, Columbus, and Minneapolis in the near future. She will do national television programs during the winter. A new home and her hobby of restoring antique picture frames takes up any "spare" time left over from her crowded schedule. As one of her prizes, and her final activity as "Mrs. America," she and the entire family will return to Miami Beach next spring for a week's vacation and the crowning of next year's "Mrs. America."



"Founded by a Founder" is a distinction claimed only by Omicron chapter at the University of Illinois. Frances E. Haven Moss, assisted by Violet Jayne Schmidt (Michigan), dean of women at Illinois, sponsored a local group which became a part of Gamma Phi Beta on May 24, 1913.

Omicron is also the only chapter to have initiated a daughter of a Founder, Alida Helen Moss. The chapter is fortunate in having had the guidance of Mrs. Moss who lived in Urbana until her death in 1937. Among the many Omicron members who have given distinguished service to the Sorority is Evelyn Gooding Dippell who served as Grand President from 1950-54.

Alumnæ Sponsor Benefit Art Shows

Nine Kansas Members Do Just "A Little Bit More"!

A year ago Hutchinson, Kansas, alumnæ felt they wanted, according to the Sigma song, to do just "a little bit more." Their membership, largely Sigma (Kansas U.) from Alden, Anthony, Lyons, Pratt and Hutchinson totaled twenty-three. Their average meeting attendance was nine.

Within a year, without conscious effort, they upped their magazine sales 67%.

HALF of Beta Upsilon's pledging came as a result of Vinita Hood Hoffman's, Beta Chi, hard summer's work.

When Hutchinson's president, Marguerite Jackman (Kansas), asked if the chapter would care to cooperate in the Mildred Randall Memorial Art Show, it was decided that they would be in charge of hospitality and the High Tea to be served the sponsors of the show. The Randall Show was held under the auspices of the Reno County Unit of the American Cancer Society. Mrs. Randall, outstanding Kansas artist and Republican, had died of cancer the year before. Hutchinson, Ashland, and Dodge City Art Associations were giving gift pictures to be sold for the Cancer Fund at the show.

Since this was their first local undertaking, the Hutchinson alumnæ made their plans very carefully.

The benefit held by the Republican women of San Mateo County, California, May 2, 1962, was studied.

A theme was selected from Keats, "A thing of beauty is a joy forever."

One thousand reservations slips were printed and distributed to various clubs and groups by the alumnæ. This slip was based on a form used by the Poetry Society of America for their banquet at the Astor Hotel, New York. It does away with the expensive printing of tickets and solicitation for their sale. The reservations chairman keeps an alphabetical list which is checked at the door.

Six of Mildred's pictures were used for display at the First National Bank, Hutchinson High School, and a few carefully chosen clubs.

The *Hutchinson News*, which goes to half of Kansas, carried four articles and two pictures, one of the Gamma Phi Betas. The *Wichita Eagle* carried a very complete notice as well.

At the tea, each of the nine Gamma Phi Betas wore beautiful pink carnations tied with pink ribbon.

The tea table, shaped in a Hogarth curve, was skirted with gold satin. The centerpiece was a large arrangement of yellow daffodils and green fern in a glass compote. Two alumnæ brought elegant family silver to sparkle on the table.

The High Tea menu: chicken livers wrapped in bacon, finger sandwiches of turkey and egg and olive, petits fours, cookies, grapes dipped in powdered sugar, tea and coffee. No wonder so many came back for seconds!

Guests in the Grand Ballroom of the Hotel Baker sat at round tables seating eight. The pictures were hung on the walls of the Ballroom.

Aside from the reservation slips, the following things were done to save money: binding twine was used to hang pictures instead of wire. To our amazement, this was much easier than wire and blended perfectly with the beige walls. Filing cards bearing the names of each picture were attached to the frames with masking tape.

Music was performed by Hutchinson High Chorale and top

soloists. Music ranged from folk singing to tuneful classics. There was some music every hour of the showing.

To Marguerite's surprise, she was later called to Wichita for a Cancer Clinic meeting of twenty-eight counties. The American Cancer Society was eager to hear about the Randall Show. It is hoped that the idea may be widely used in Kansas towns next year.

Oh, yes! Although the show was strictly promotional, \$100 was contributed to Cancer Research.

"We're amazed," say the nine alumnæ, "that such 'a little bit more' could be so richly rewarding!"

"Fiesta del Arte" is Palo Alto Project

"Fiesta del Arte" was the title and setting of Palo Alto Alumnæ Chapter's third annual art show-benefit sale which was held May 25th in the beautifully authentic Spanish-Mission home and gardens of Mrs. Longueville H. Price, in Atherton, California.

Sixty Bay Area artists participated in the show. They priced their original works at bargain prices for the benefit of the many philanthropies supported by the chapter. The offerings included many new and unusual media along with the more accepted and expected objects of art. The Pennsylvania State University . . .

108 Years Young and Still Growing!

In 1855 an obscure "cow College" was erected in the hills of Pennsylvania to educate a handful of young farmers in "the natural and exact sciences." Today this same institution occupies over 4000 acres of land and offers programs of study in almost every field imaginable to some 20,000 students who claim The Pennsylvania State University as their alma mater.

The University was originally known as the Farmers' High School of Pennsylvania. In 1859 the campus had only a single five-story building, the first Old Main, in which the students ate, slept and attended the classes taught by four faculty members.

The Farmers' High School became the Agricultural College of Pennsylvania in 1862, and a year later the State Legislature designated it as the land-grant college of the Commonwealth. In 1874 the name was again changed to The Pennsylvania State College. State appropriations of several thousand dollars set off an expansion program which has been going on ever since. Buildings have been mushrooming continuously and future plans call for as much new construction by 1975 as was completed during the first hundred years.

Even before its name was changed to The Pennsylvania State University in November 1953, Penn State had been functioning as a university for many years. Graduate work had been offered since 1862. Today Penn State ranks eleventh in the nation in full-time enrollment.

Alpha Upsilon chapter of Gamma Phi Beta was instituted at Penn State on May 21, 1932, when Laodelphia, a four-year-old local society was granted a charter. It was the eighth-national sorority to be chartered on the campus. Members of Alpha (Syracuse), Alpha Eta (Ohio Wesleyan) and Alpha Pi (West Virginia) chapters were on hand to help the new initiates celebrate at a banquet held at the Nittany Lion Inn.

A picnic each June features the selection of the Gamma Phi "Man in the Moon" for the following year. Graduating seniors are feted each year with a cookout at Whipple's Dam, followed by a skit and party in the suite.

Members of Alpha Upsilon have been very active as a group, and individually, bringing home many honors. During Greek Week we placed first in the bridge competition and second in the window display contest.

Gail Flynn, Sue Bicksler, Marty Welch and Nancy Quigley were selected to participate in the Penn State Study Abroad Program in Europe last spring. Pat Rife, Marty Welch and Nancy Quigley have been elected to Scrolls, the senior women's hat society. Nancy Quigley has also been chosen the Panhellenic rush chairman for 1963-64. Kathy Mueller and Joanne Yamas are new members of Phi Kappa Phi. Many of our other girls belong to honoraries in their respective colleges.

Alpha Upsilon is not lacking in beauty either. Mary Jane Mosher recently represented the state of Ohio in the National Cherry Blossom Festival held in Washington D.C. Marcia Strawinski and Kathy Watts qualified as finalists in the Miss Centre County Contest last May.

In 1957 a Master's Degree in Education program was started.

At present there are 18 buildings on campus valued at approximately 13 million dollars. It is the most rapidly growing teachers' college in the state with an enrollment of 2,250 students. It also has the distinction for the third year in a row of graduating more prospective teachers than any other institution in the state.

Thus we feel that Gamma Phi Beta has a fine school and a grand new chapter to represent her on the plains of Nebraska.

The Kearney Area alumnae are grateful to all who helped Gamma Kappa chapter become a reality, and certainly the name of Mary Glendon Trussell cannot pass without mention. She laid much of the groundwork and did a lot of planning. Our hats are off to her!

The opportunity to exchange ideas was welcomed by all delegates and guests, and all members present realized again that anxieties and problems are lessened as experiences are shared and the activities of Greek-letter and alumnae chapters are coordinated. Unselfish cooperation and the understanding of each other's viewpoint points the way to workable solutions of problems.

At each conference, Province Directors summarized in their reports the progress and accomplishments of Greek-letter and alumnae chapters as well as noting the areas in which increased effort and cooperation are needed. Grand Council

representatives presented news of activities and developments on the international level.

Our theme, "Accent on Excellence" provided the keynote for fine addresses by guest speakers and for Greek-letter and alumnae round tables. In joint discussion groups there were many thoughtful and penetrating analyses of our own attitudes and procedures which guide us in our efforts to attain a higher standard of excellence.

Many valuable recommendations and resolutions were formulated, all aiming to improve rushing procedures and techniques and the awareness of and training for life-long membership responsibility.

The climax of each conference Saturday was a gay and beautiful Carnation Banquet with Sunday mornings devoted to final business sessions and Panhellenic functions.

In the first place, the Editor reports that for the first time in fifteen years, every single chapter sent a report for this issue. (National officers, take note. It can be done!) This is a record in itself, and does indicate an increased awareness of responsibility. However, it is not just the act of sending these reports which is so impressive, but rather the information in them which is so exciting. It is upon the latter that I base my claims.

Observe the number elected to other honoraries, including Phi Kappa Phi, and count the number "tapped" for Mortar Board. If your checking agrees with mine, you will find Mortar Board members chosen from 27 campuses. Records such as these are really outstanding because elections in these organizations are

awards of merit, "based upon scholarship of superior quality, and upon achievement of leadership qualities, character, and good campus citizenship." In other words, these Gamma Phi Betas who have qualified are all-around students who have proved their appreciation of the opportunities offered to them; who have pursued academic excellence; who have accepted their responsibilities as leaders in their campus communities. They are youthful citizens who have become aware of the need seriously to prove their worth, and have set about to accomplish their goal.

We salute them! They give us cause for increased pride in membership, and they bring honor to Gamma Phi Beta. They offer evidence which should convince even the most skeptical that the Sorority does stimulate and encourage the development of the "whole girl" so that she may have a life of purpose and promise.

When Robert Fontaine, a current novelist was asked recently what he thought life really means, he replied with the following quotation: "To live is good. To live *vividly* is better. To live *vividly together* is best." Our Honor members are in a position to understand these three sentences. They have indicated they are accepting their opportunities; they are developing within themselves their greatest individual potential; and they are sharing that potential with others so they may achieve the ultimate in living.

What Is It Worth To You?

Somewhere between the day when our Four Founders constituted Gamma Phi Beta's entire membership and the present time when we have nearly 40,000 in our ranks, each of us has had our own special Gamma Phi Beta days. They were the days of going away to school, of becoming part of a wonderful new way of living and learning. They were the days when we first learned to love and cherish the Sorority and all it had to offer us. They were the days, also, when the Sorority first cherished us, helping us through the initial steps of becoming good campus citizens and launching us on the unending task of trying to become adults.

Two months from now, our annual Founders Day observance will again give each of us the privilege of presenting personal birthday gifts to the Sorority which has meant so much to us through the years. These birthday gifts—no matter how small—are a most important part of our progress as they are all credited to the principal of the Endowment Fund to be used for loans to chapters for housing needs—either buying, building, or remodeling. Income from the Endowment Fund provides for rushing aid, expenses for scholarship students, special educational loans to individual members, and for the Lindsey Barbee Fellowship award. Truly the Endowment Fund can be called our college chapter fund since its function is to provide financial aid to college chapters and their members.

Many of our members who have been out of school for some time and have had no regular contact with Greek-letter chapters in the interim may ask, "Has Gamma Phi Beta changed over the years? Can it, or does it, offer today all it gave me when I was in college?" The answer to both these questions is YES. Gamma Phi Beta *has* changed, but only in size and distinction. The same qualities that attracted us as rushees and that we loved as pledges and collegiate members are still there. They are the same today and always will be. They are part of the Gamma Phi Beta heritage. And, yes, Gamma Phi Beta offers just as much to the college women of today as it always has. But we must realize that continuing to offer the benefits and advantages we had becomes ever more costly each year. The 75 college chapters across the U.S. and in Canada which constitute our Gamma Phi Beta family must be properly maintained in order to attract quality girls each year in rushing. In addition to this, we must found new chapters on desirable campuses

whenever possible so that we can keep pace with our sister groups in NPC. Money to finance these new chapters comes from the Expansion Fund. This is why every member's financial support of the Sorority's Expansion Fund as well as the Endowment Fund becomes increasingly important every year.

The average member is relatively uninformed and in many cases uninterested in Sorority finances, especially if there has been no recent contact with either a Greek-letter or an alumnae chapter. But it is essential that we all understand that we *all* must give if Gamma Phi Beta is to grow. Each of us, as part of our life-time membership responsibility must willingly share in the work of assuring the Sorority sufficient money to carry on these growth functions. Our personal contributions to the Endowment and Expansion Funds are the main guarantee that Gamma Phi Beta's growth can continue.

Our Founders Day donations are not only a personal birthday gift and token of gratitude but an indication that we are willing to underwrite our Gamma Phi Beta heritage. They are an indication that we are willing to help Gamma Phi Beta give in like measure to other girls what it has given us, and to understand that "in like measure" in the expanded and involved set-up of the present is vastly more expensive than it was in the past.

What we contribute on Founders Day bears much thought. Our birthday gifts of gratitude will help Gamma Phi Beta grow, and in helping Gamma Phi Beta grow we are also helping preserve one of our finest American traditions, the voluntary social group. These organizations which are founded on specific principles and whose members are bound together by common ideals, aims, and interests are one of our nation's greatest assets. All of us have had the opportunity to be sisters in such an organization, enjoying for life all its membership offers. Additionally, we are all stock-holders in an international, non-profit corporation. Scholastic Success . . . A Secret Formula?

We wondered too, when we heard about the eight seniors elected to Phi Beta Kappa from Beta Sigma chapter at Washington State University. So we asked the chapter president, Mary Maynard, and here is her answer:

When Beta Sigma chapter of Gamma Phi Beta was founded one of its main goals was to achieve in the field of scholarship. Thus through our few years here at Washington State University we have been striving for this goal. Once you get to the top it often takes more effort to stay there.

One of the vital things we consider when we pledge a girl at Beta Sigma is her scholarship and her scholarship potential. With a good foundation in our pledges we can build from there. As a pledge, she has a few study rules to follow which will serve as a guide in formation of her future study habits. When she becomes a member there are no longer any rules unless she falls below a 2.00 in any one semester. We conduct a study table Monday through Thursday nights which the pledges attend and members may attend if they wish.

Our scholarship is achieved through each individual girl's effort. Yet each girl is more than willing to help another. At the beginning of each semester the members sign up for subjects in which they feel they would be able to help pledges.

Each semester a scholarship dinner is held at our house with alumnae from Pullman as our guests. The girls with a 3.00 average or better for the previous semester are honored at this dinner. Especially honored is the girl with the highest grade point average of all the girls—a trophy is inscribed with her name. Also, our alumnae give the scholarship necklace to the girl who has made the most improvement in her grades. Scholarship cups are presented to those girls who have attained the 3.00 and above grade point average. If girls have already received a cup in previous semesters they may (if they so desire) put the money, which would have gone for their cup, in a book fund.

On campus each semester are given the City Panhellenic trophy for the living group with the highest grade point average, a trophy for the most improvement, and one for the pledge class with the highest grade point average. In the last few years Beta Sigma has held all of these trophies at some time. We held the Panhellenic trophy for three consecutive semesters, then dropped to second for one semester, and now hold the trophy again for the Fall 1962 semester.

Growth in knowledge is one of the prime objects in the mind of a girl at Beta Sigma—each in her own field of interest. Every girl takes pride in the achievements in our chapter and it is through every girl that we can attain our goals.))))

Show Business on the Campus







- By *September 15*, send eight college calendars on Form #G1-241b to Central Office and one to Province Collegiate Director.
- By *October 1* unless otherwise notified, send Grand President business for consideration at fall council meeting; include business for consideration of convention, in fall preceding convention. Immediately after pledging (immediately after opening of college if pledging is deferred), send lists of chapter members and pledges (new and holdovers) to Central Office and Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241c and Form #G1-241d.
- By *February 15*, send list of chapter members and pledges (new and holdovers) to Central Office and Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241c and Form #G1-241d.
- By *February 25*, send Grand President business for consideration at spring council meeting.
- Not later than *March 20*, send name and home address of new Membership Chairman to Central Office.
- As soon as information is available, send eight lists of new chapter officers to Central Office and one list to Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241e. Send name and home address of Magazine Chairman to International Magazine Chairman.
- By *May 15*, send to Central Office list of chapter members (undergraduate and alumnæ) who have passed away since preceding May 15.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN:
