Airdrie Kincaid Pinkerton

Editor, The Crescent 1938-1948



Airdrie Kincaid Pinkerton, former editor of The CRESCENT, died in Santa Barbara, California, on June 26, 1966, two days after she had undergone heart surgery and after many years of unstinting service to her family, her community and to Gamma Phi Beta.

Airdrie Pinkerton was born on April 24, 1891, at Olympia, Washington, where her father had established a pioneer medical practice upon his discharge from the Union Army. Because both of her parents were native Scots, she was named for a small town in Scotland where her mother's family had been prominent in village life. The unusual name is being perpetuated through her daughter, Airdrie Paula (Polly) Pinkerton Martin (Alpha Epsilon) and her granddaughter, Airdrie Marie Martin. Other survivors include her husband, Roy, two step-sons and seven other grandchildren.

Airdrie attended the University of Washington where she pledged Gamma Phi Beta, following in the footsteps of her sister Zoe Kincaid Penlington, a founder of Lambda chapter. Her first writing for The Crescent was during her undergraduate days when she was Crescent Correspondent and a member of Theta Sigma Phi, national journalism honorary.

In 1923 she married Roy Pinkerton, then editor of the Seattle Star. The years between have taken her from Seattle to Cleveland to San Diego to Ventura, always actively at her husband's side in his various newspaper enterprises.

In 1938 she was appointed international chairman of publicity, during which time she originated and edited *Flashes*, a Gamma Phi Beta newspaper published twice a year. She served for 18 months as an associate editor of The Crescent under Lindsey Barbee before she was named editor-in-chief in July, 1938. For the ten years that she led The Crescent, she changed the format to its present size, increased the photographic coverage and concentrated on biographies of prominent alumnae.

Airdrie devoted herself to many civic and community projects. She was chairman of the Home Service department of the Red Cross during World War II; she conceived and planned the first Debutante Ball in Ventura; she was founder of the Ventura County Forum of the Arts; she always worked with her husband's newspapers as a reporter, editor or coordinator.

Old issues of The Crescent make frequent references to the many sides of Airdrie Pinkerton; her love for unusual and

dramatic earrings; her collection of branding irons; the more than 200 dolls she brought from almost every land on the globe during her travels; her green thumb that she employed so lovingly around the Pinkerton's Ventura ranch; and the love and devotion she lavished on her comfortable livable book-laden home.

Many have paid tribute to her through the years and each bespeaks a facet of the personality of a great woman.

Lindsey Barbee once said, "She lives on a ranch—because she's Airdrie, she can live any place. She fits on the ranch that is her home as easily and as naturally as she would fit on Fifth Avenue, or the Rue Royale."

When she was appointed editor, a childhood friend, Margaret Meany Younger (Lambda), wrote: "She has a professional type mind, enormous bump of curiosity, dynamic spirit, infectious sense of humor, abiding loyalty for friends, ideas and ideals."

When she retired as editor, Alice Wieber Fitzgerald, past Grand President, wrote: "She is vivacious but never silly, she has wit and humor in large quantity but never uses it to the discomfiture of others, she is completely loyal without being mawkishly sentimental."

Harold Bachmann, still the account executive who handles the printing of The Crescent for George Banta Company, says: "She was always one of my favorite Gamma Phis and I worked closely with her for a long time. I also spent some time at their Ventura ranch and found them to be delightful hosts. She was an avid letter writer and we carried on an extensive correspondence even these many years since she left the editorship. I shall miss her deeply."

Perhaps the most glowing tribute to Airdrie appeared in the editor's column of the *Ventura County Star-Free Press*. It was written by her long-time friend and editorial associate, Julius Gius, who eulogizes: "She had a heart so big there was love for those of all ages and all colors in all economic strata. Among those in deepest mourning for her are the legions who remember warm and simple acts of affection—words of condolence in time of strife, a suggestion for meeting a problem, a small gift for a special occasion, a smile always."

Many of the world's people and all of Gamma Phi Beta will miss the wise counsel and the lasting devotion of this truly great leader, Airdrie Kincaid Pinkerton.

Message of the Grand President

Traditionally, it is the duty of the Grand President to review the past biennium. The reports of all the International officers will be found in the printed convention booklet. My summary, therefore, will not be in detail.

One of the most time-consuming responsibilities of the Grand President is the handling of extensive correspondence. Reports come to her from all departments of the Sorority and it is of utmost importance that she be informed on all facets of our work. Much of the correspondence requires research, careful appraisal and considerable thought before it can be correct-

ly and adequately answered.

Travel and attendance at various meetings are important facets of the office. There have been four semi-annual meetings of Grand Council, each lasting for more than a week, meetings with the Philanthropy and Endowment-Crescent boards and with the Centennial chairmen. There have been five installations of new Greek-letter chapters in which the Grand President has taken part, several speaking engagements and eleven chapter visits. One Province Conference was attended and one Officer Training School. There have been two meetings of the National Panhellenic Conference, two annual conventions of the National Association of Women Deans and Counselors and two other conferences of sorority and fraternity leaders.

One of the most outstanding achievements of the biennium has been the re-location of Central Office. Improvements in service to the membership have become possible through larger quarters, better and more modern equipment and a larger

staff.

Distribution of the new Manual which clarifies and coordinates our ritual was completed in 1965 and our distinguished new Guide for Pledges was distributed last September. The new edition of the History of Gamma Phi Beta is a companion volume and third book on standards will be published this fall.

For a long time, Gamma Phi Beta has benefited from the work done by a traveling secretary and in recent years we have increased the number from one to three. They provide, through their reports to Grand Council, a liaison with the chapters which has not been available under any other program. This closer communication strengthens our unity; members of Grand Council are better informed and can, therefore, be of more help, if help is needed.

In August 1965 an Officer Training School was held at the Alpha Xi house in Dallas. An expanded program of this type of training is recommended to include more officers for refresher courses and with special consideration given to more

facilities for help and training of advisory personnel.

We have problems, as do all other sorority and fraternity groups. No report to you can be complete without dwelling on them for a few moments. In the first weeks of the biennium, we were faced with the California deadlines for signing certificates pertaining to membership policies. Every effort was made to carry out both the letter and spirit of the 1964 convention resolutions, but, on those campuses where we could not successfully implement a decision to remain as non-signers and when the interpretation of our legal counsel was that we could sign and remain within the provisions of our bylaws, we

have permitted our chapters to sign the certificates, usually under protest and always with reluctance. The requirements for statements of membership policies increased markedly after the pronouncement of the Commissioner of Education in the summer of 1965 that federal funds would be withheld from institutions harboring any organization with discriminatory practices or any which might be interpreted as discriminatory. The inclusion in the Higher Education Act of 1965 of an amendment which prohibits any interference with the internal operations and membership policies of fraternities and sororities and other private organizations was a tremendous accomplishment. Many of you responded quickly to the requests for letters and wires to senators and congressmen and the combined efforts of members of many fraternal organizations resulted in the passage of the Act with "our" amendment included. We still face problems of implementation of the provisions of this amendment and it appears to be unknown or ignored by some state commissions, but fraternity leaders are actively at work on ways to make this legislation useful to us. Grand Council will continue to keep you informed as fully as possible on these vital matters.

Solutions for our many problems and success for our many hopes are dependent upon two things: womanpower and funds. More of our members must assume militant roles in the preservation and improvement of the fraternal system. To take such parts, the membership must be fully informed, officers must have adequate training, pledges must have the finest, inspired pledge education possible.

Womanpower. Numerically we have it and we have many who have given of themselves for years. But the hard truth is that too few actively take part, actively share and fully rejoice in the beauty and warmth and worth that is Gamma Phi Beta. Try to carry home with you the message of sharing, of taking part, of enjoying together the enrichment which comes from

working together toward our goals.

Funds. With more sharing in the financial support of the Sorority, a less heavy load will be borne by existing trusts and funds. It would not be difficult to take the directory page in The Crescent and, department by department, give sound examples of what could be accomplished with more revenue. These would not be frivolous things, but constructive and helpful improvements which would give us a firmer unity and emphasize the stature of the Sorority in the eyes of its detractors. Not only is additional revenue needed for progress, but it is imperative just to maintain all we have now and attempt to do. There is no household, no business, no organization which can function as it should in 1966 on a 1958 income.

Gamma Phi Beta's future is bright, her possibilities are limitless if together we act with wisdom, with unity of purpose and with love in our hearts.

At the opening session of Gamma Phi Beta's fifty-second international convention, Orra Spencer Reid gave her biennial report to the delegates. The above is a condensation of her address of the Grand President.

Editorial

A Change Of Administration

On June 23, 1966, the Convention assembled unanimously elected Aleene Carter Thieme (Sigma) International Grand President of Gamma Phi Beta.

In the Dallas air terminal, en route home to California, Mrs. Thieme suffered a vitreous hemorrhage of her right eye and complete loss of vision in that eye. On arrival in Redlands, her ophthalmologist advised that it was imperative that she withdraw from all activities which would involve eye strain. By following his directive, she has been assured that eventually her vision will be restored. It was, therefore, impossible for Mrs. Thieme to assume the Presidency on August 1.

As provided in the bylaw procedure of Gamma Phi Beta, the Grand Council-elect has unanimously chosen Ardis McBroom Marek (Epsilon) as International Grand President to succeed Mrs. Thieme.

Mrs. Thieme attended Smith College for two years before transferring to the University of Kansas where she was graduated in 1927. Through the years she has served Gamma Phi Beta in many capacities: as province director of old Province VII N; as publications chairman under Grand Presidents Elizabeth Arnold, Beatrice Wittenberg and Orra Reid. She was elected Director of Expansion at the 1962 Convention and upon the resignation of Barbara Termohlen Cooper, she became Collegiate Vice President.

It was through her persistent efforts that many Gamma Phi Beta manuals have been revised. Some of the publications on which she has worked are the manuals for province alumnæ directors, province collegiate directors, alumnae recommendations committees, alumnae advisory committees and the A-200 section of the *President's Book*. Last fall the new *Guide for Pledges* was published under her direction and this fall the new *Membership Chairman's Manual* will be available.

With gratitude for her many services and with deep regret, Gamma Phi Beta accepts the resignation of Aleene Carter Thieme.

Ardis McBroom Marek was graduated from Northwestern University in 1937 and has worked with Gamma Phi Beta consistently during her alumna years. She served as an assistant editor of The Crescent for many years before she became editor-in-chief in 1948, a position she held with distinction until her retirement in 1964. During her term of office she worked with nine Grand Councils and developed The Crescent through changes in format policies and procedures to keep pace with the changing times. She never waivered in her desire to produce a top-notch magazine which would hold a high place among fraternity publications. She served on the Editors' Conference of the National Panhellenic Conference and was in demand as a public speaker among both sorority and fraternity groups.

Since Mrs. Marek left her post as editor of The Crescent, she has served as co-chairman of the Centennial committee where she and Ruth Bartels Fox have laid the first long-range plans for our 100th anniversary celebration in 1074

tion in 1974.

There is probably no one more completely informed on sorority matters, no one more devotedly loyal to our aims and principles, and no one more closely in touch with the current campus scene.

It is with confidence and a great deal of pride that THE CRESCENT presents Ardis McBroom Marek, International Grand President.

ENTION '66

The Arkansas sun shone brightly on Sunday afternoon, June 19 and the Hot Springs air terminal was teeming with happy young faces as delegates from 82 collegiate chapters of Gamma Phi Beta arrived for the fifty-second international convention. The airport bus and many taxis carried the girls and tons of brilliantly-colored luggage to the welcoming verandas of the Arlington Hotel. The hostess Province Director, Mary Kay Dorman Kabler (Kansas), convention chairman, and her committee were on hand to greet the arrivals. Gamma Gamma chapter's mode and brown satin banner fluttered from the mezzanine. The strains of Gamma Phi Beta songs recorded by Beta Upsilon filled the lobby. The air of true Southern hospitality was all around.

Collegiate delegates and visitors and alumnæ members representing 208 alumnæ chapters registered with the hotel in the main lobby and checked in with the Gamma Phi Beta registration desk on the mezzanine. Members of the registration-reservations committeee, the regional chairman and the convention secretary and treasurer manned the desk until midnight, and with remarkable cheer (despite their weariness) handed out the handsome brocade convention kits and explained all the little details to the first-timers. They issued name tags, hats for Carnival and badges for Honors night.

Happiness is Being a Gamma Phi Beta

An informal banquet opened the festivities in the main dining room at six o'clock. Shocking pink Parisian umbrellas centered each table proclaiming to the world that "Happiness is being a Gamma Phi Beta." Menus repeated the color of the centerpiece and under one chair at each table was another shocking pink folder stating "Happiness is . . . winning the centerpiece." Hostesses were members of Phi, Alpha Delta, Columbia and St. Louis chapters, under the chairmanship of Kathryn Kraus Schwarting (Wisconsin and St. Louis). Nathalie Irwin Hise (Illinois) opened the program singing "The Star Spangled Banner" and Lynne Logan Clawson (Kansas) sang "The Canadian National Anthem." Kathy Schwarting, toastmistress, welcomed the 364 members present. Dorothy Stone Haren (Kansas) introduced her fellow province collegiate directors and Lela Smith Weirich (Oklahoma) presented the province alumnæ directors. Mary Kay Dorman Kabler introduced the convention committee chairmen and Mary Ann Bulla (Oklahoma) led the singing of a new song written by members of Phi chapter "Happiness Is Being a Gamma Phi Beta." Each guest received a brown and brass memo pad engraved with the sorority's name.

After the dinner members adjourned to a lobby meeting room, where Elizabeth Wheeler Olsen (Michigan) housing chairman, showed slides of new Gamma Phi Beta chapter houses, lodges and suites.

Later collegiates and alumnæ gathered on the pool patio for a rousing songfest. The old favorites were in popular demand and new songs were introduced.

At 9:00 collegiate and alumnæ directors entertained their individual provinces at coke parties, where members renewed old friendships and met the new conventioneers.

The Sound of the Gavel

At 8:45 on Monday morning Orra Spencer Reid (Michigan), International Grand President, led the assembled delegates and other members in formal opening exercises and the gavel sounded to open Gamma Phi Beta's fifty-second convention.

Eleanor J. Sieg (Iowa) Executive Secretary-Treasurer, called the roll of delegates and Mrs. Reid introduced the convention parliamentarian, Miss Clara Weigel of Denver. June Mathews Jubelt (Illinois), regional chairman, gave the address of welcome to the convention. After committee appointments were announced the international officers were formally introduced. Official pages for the day were collegiate non-delegate Gamma Phi Beta daughters.

Mrs. Reid presented "The Message of the Grand President" in which she reported on the accomplishments of the last biennium and outlined the plans for the future. "We have been given a great opportunity," she said, "and a solemn responsibility to preserve, enhance and pass on all that which has come to us, to pass it on with its significance undimmed, its success demonstrated by our example." Following a coffee break on the mezzanine, the convention reassembled to hear the formal reports of international chairmen: Barbara Westover Sheldon (Washington) camp chairman; Janet Milligan Heaton (Denver), philanthropy board chairman; Dorothy Stark Kenney (Syracuse), magazine chairman and Mary Glendon Trussell (Northwestern), Director of Expansion. Mrs. Trussell paid special tribute to our "baby" chapters which had been chartered during the last two years. Engraved silver baby cups were presented to Gamma Nu (Lamar State College of Technology, Beaumont, Texas), Gamma Xi (University of Tennessee, Knoxville, Tennessee), Gamma Omicron (University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky), Gamma Pi (Mankato State College, Mankato, Minnesota) and Gamma Rho (Wisconsin State University, Oshkosh, Wisconsin).

After the morning business session members lunched in the hotel dining room, or had box lunches on the pool patio.

"What's Your Advice?"

The second business session at 2 o'clock opened with Elizabeth Fee Arnold (Colorado State), Past Grand President, introducing the National Interfraternity Council film "What's Your Advice?" This film, produced on the campus of Butler University in Indianapolis takes its audience on a tour of fraternity and sorority activities and points out the common aims and purposes of fraternal existence.

Formal reports from additional international chairmen followed: Cherie McElhinney Olsen (Iowa), Gamma Phi Beta Foundation; Ardis McBroom Marek (Northwestern) and Ruth Bartels Fox (Northwestern), centennial committee; and Mary Jane Hipp Misthos (Colorado College), Endowment-Crescent Board.

In presenting the sorority budget, Bette Heflin Egbert (Arizona), Director of Finance, used an original and graphic dis-

play to show the sorority's growth. A large hand-made wall hanging, six by nine feet, depicted "The Gamma Phi Beta Family Tree." Designed and hand sewn by Mrs. Egbert and her daughter, Helen (Arizona), the display is made on a background of sky blue felt appliquéd with monograms, pledge pins, lamps and scrolls. On the brown tree branches the pink carnations represent the Greek-letter chapters; the dark green leaves the alumnæ chapters; the light green leaves the projected growth in the number of alumnæ chapters; and the pledge pins superimposed on pink carnations indicate the Greek-letter chapters of the future. Mrs. Egbert used this dramatic device to explain the proposed budget increase necessitated by the continuing growth of both Greek-letter and alumnæ activities.

Peanuts and olives were featured at the formal banquet on Monday evening, which honored our Founders and members of past Grand Councils. Fay Davis Deupree (Oklahoma) was toastmistress for the evening and introduced Bonnie Allen (Psi) who toasted our Founders and Tresa Hall (Beta Omicron) who spoke on the dedication of our past officers. The Grand President introduced Dr. William Zerman, executive secretary of the Fraternity of Phi Gamma Delta, who outlined the many challenges facing fraternity members today. He commanded the undergraduate students for facing up to these problems and encouraged them to set the pace in standards, scholarship and service for the rest of their college campuses.

Following the banquet more than 400 Gamma Phi Betas and guests met Dr. Zerman and the members of Grand Council at a formal reception. The punch table was laid with a brown taffeta cloth, silver candelabra held brown tapers, and the centerpiece was a lovely crescent of pink carnations and brown foliage. Topeka alumnæ chapter was hostess for the reception, with Dorothy Smith Gabel (Kansas) as chairman.

While the joint meeting of collegiates and alumnæ was being conducted in the convention hall, the Business Management Conference was underway. This conference (described in length on page 16) considered the problems pertinent to the work of house corporation boards. Directing the discussion were Bette Heflin Egbert, Director of Finance; Elizabeth Wheeler Olsen, housing chairman and Ruby McMurtry Foster (Vanderbilt) counselor to house corporations.

Later in the afternoon the round table group divided into two sections to discuss those questions of special interest to

alumnæ and collegiates.

Alumnæ Round Tables

At the alumnæ round table, under the direction of Virginia Forsythe Vint (Missouri), a group of experts presented a panel discussion entitled "A Successful Alumnæ Chapter: a Composite Picture." The topics discussed were:

Betty Althouse, Organization: The importance of good officers, committee chairmen, working notebooks, bylaws, bud-

geting and well laid plans for the entire year.

Audrey Shafer, Membership: The transition from collegiate to alumnæ membership, increasing paid memberships and maintaining chapter and alumnæ files on members.

Connie Spanier, Programs: Suggested programs of interest to

all age groups.

Ruth Dawson, Ritual: The effectiveness of employing the use of our rituals at regular meetings and on special occasions.

Beth Wheeler, Public Relations: Pointers on good public relations within Panhellenic and public circles, with tips on those stories which will be of interest to the news media.

Virginia Bear, Public Relations: The importance of good relations within our own membership through newsletters, telephone reminders and notes to members on special achievement.

Virginia Douglass, Philanthropies: The importance of participation in our national and local philanthropies, listing successful local philanthropic projects.

Dorothy Darling, Greek-letter—Alumnæ Relations: The responsibility of each group to the other in building a line of communication and understanding between the two groups.

Lucy Forman, Womanpower: The need for active participation on as wide a scale as possible of all alumnæ in an area, each contributing in her own measure through her own special talents.

Money-Go Round: Many representatives of alumnæ chapters described tested fund-raising ideas. A new booklet is available from Central office listing the most successful ideas and is available for \$1.00.

Mothers Clubs: A general discussion of how mothers clubs help Greek-letter chapters and how more interest can be engendered in this facet of Gamma Phi Beta.

The Pink Carnation Banquet

The soft glow of hurricaned candlelight flickering above tall graceful balustrade candleholders . . . sparkling white linen table covers . . . an immense colored replica of the Gamma Phi Beta coat-of-arms high above the speaker's table . . . miniature lights twinkling among trellises of greenery . . . and everywhere, everywhere pink carnations!

Missing Links Become Connecting Links

The first Business Management Conference of Gamma Phi Beta Sorority, initiated at the 1962 Convention, proved so beneficial that it has since become a regular feature of each convention program. Approximately 40 alumnæ and 3 Greek-letter representatives attended the third such conference held at the 1966 International Convention in Hot Springs.

Startled to hear themselves referred to as "Missing Links," the conferees were relieved to learn that the local house corporation's existence has proved to be so necessary to improved relationships between alumnæ and Greek-letter chapters that the "missing links" are now considered to be "connecting links" when house boards fulfill their complete responsibilities.

Despite their prime responsibility being restricted to owning and maintaining physical properties of the local house corporation, house board directors were challenged to new areas of service when Bette Heflin Egbert, Director of Finance, discussed increased efficiency in house management; use of up-to-date business procedures and modern bookkeeping methods; continued promotion of scholastic excellence through adequate provision of study facilities; fostering gracious living within the sorority houses by enforced house rules; training collegiates in correct corporate procedures; planning a sound, financial framework with long-range needs included; setting up of financial reserves to provide modern housing through realistic budgeting and sound advisory guidance of chapter finances.

Ruby McMurtry Foster, counselor to house corporation boards, pointed out variances in local house corporation bylaws with the international bylaws and gave detailed instructions on amending articles of incorporation and local bylaws when required. Emphasizing repeatedly that "A Greek-letter chapter's future success is dependent on the legal and financial structure of its house corporation" or "Competition with our Panhellenic friends, demands of university administrations for more and better housing, increased cost of living index, each or all, prohibit any effort but the best on the part of the local corporation officers. The importance of periodic studies and

reevaluations of articles of incorporation and bylaws would result in officer duties being more clearly defined, more easily understood by alumnæ and collegiate members of the house board. Legal mechanics for preparation of long range financial needs will create reserves for sudden emergencies and thus relieve the strain on international funds which are in such demand for the expansion program.

Increased collegiate activities and housing needs necessitate progressive actions to maintain an open line of communication between all groups of Gamma Phi Beta. The house corporation occupies the unique position of providing a meeting for both alumnæ and the Greek-letter chapter, where the expressions of new ideas from the energetic and idealistic collegiates are generally merged with the practical, experienced maturity in modified action. To be a successful "connecting link" requires understanding from both points of view, faithfulness to an accepted responsibility; and a satisfactory rapport with the college administrators in order to be prepared for future needs.

Elizabeth Wheeler Olsen, chairman of housing, emphasized the necessity of following the correct procedures for that sudden moment of panic when informed by the Dean that sororities will be expected to provide chapter housing within two years. Her report on the various chapters having completed new houses was highlighted with slides. Those representatives with unfinished building projects or who are involved in a future building project exchanged ideas and experiences to the advantage of all concerned.

Improvement must be made in creating interest among local alumnæ in their great value to the local Greek-letter chapter of volunteer alumnæ to express willingness to serve within the corporate area. The great strength of Gamma Plii Beta has been due to the fact that someone will always come forward to fill that vacant spot when the true need is clearly defined and presented. "Connecting Links" must be continually added to the great chain being formed each day.

Kathryn Herbert Winchester

Kathryn Herbert Winchester was born in 1893 in Denver, Colorado, where she was educated privately through high school.

When she entered the University of Denver in 1911, she was pledged to Theta chapter of Gamma Phi Beta. Illness forced her to remain out of school during the year 1912-13, but she returned to be elected president of Theta chapter in 1915.

Early in the fall of 1915 she was requested to conduct the initiation service of newly-installed Tau chapter at Colorado State University . . . before she had ever conducted the service for her own chapter. No member of Grand Council could be on hand, so, after a sleepless night, she initiated the charter members of Tau.

In 1920 the Winchesters moved to New York City where she worked for Edison Electric Institute for 23 years and edited their *Rote Book*. During this period she served as treasurer of the New York City alumnæ chapter for 23 years.

In 1951, Mr. and Mrs. Winchester moved to Phoenix, Arizona, where they still reside. She has always been an active member of the alumnæ chapter and has served for the past two years as ticket chairman for the Christmas project of Gamma Phi Beta.

Happiness is Helping

Portland Landmarks Preserved For Posterity

For the vital role she has played in the restoration and preservation of Oregon historical sites, Mrs. Albert H. Powers (Stanford '25) has been acclaimed Portland's "Woman of Accomplishment." A panel of five anonymous civic leaders considered more than 200 nominations before selecting those women who have contributed most substantially to community and human betterment.

Ruth McBride Powers was graduated from Stanford University where she was a member of Mu chapter of Gamma Phi Beta. She took some post graduate courses in law and moved to the Northwest with her husband in 1926. It was only then that she became seriously interested in the turbulent past of the picturesque old Oregon Territory.

As aware as she was of pioneer history in her early days in Coos County, her first 15 years in Oregon were devoted to her family and club work. She served on the national board of the General Federation of Women's clubs for 12 years as well as the board of the Oregon Federation. She helped to organize 20 junior women's clubs in Oregon and later served as national vice chairman of Junior Women's clubs.

Mrs. Powers helped to organize a youth committee, a volunteer group and forerunner of the Job Corps. She is a past president of Coos Bay Branch of the AAUW and past secretary of the Oregon association.

All this, however, was just a stepping stone to the path Mrs. Powers was to take in preserving the past. For the next 15 years she delved into Oregon history, in many instances taking an active part in salvaging remnants of a bygone era for the generations ahead. She has devoted a great deal of time and money to the restoration of historical old houses in Oregon.

She currently owns and is in the process of restoring two old homes in Oregon City. One, the General McCarver house, was brought prefabricated from the East by ship around the Horn in 1850.

When Mrs. Powers was regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution, she presented the group with a house, school and jail, historic landmarks in Champoeg. The buildings were restored by the DAR with Mrs. Powers' help and are maintained as museums open to the public.

Always interested in the Oregon Historical Society, she now serves that group as membership secretary. Last year the Portland Women's Forum named her Woman of the Year and Governor Mark O. Hatfield appointed her associate director of Oregon Landmarks. Under her leadership the Landmarks group has published a series of booklets depicting the history of the state.

Mrs. Powers is vice chairman and membership chairman of McLoughlin House Memorial association and Mission Mill Commission in Salem. She is co-founder of the Powers Public Library in Powers and one of the original members of the Technical Institute Advisory Council. She has been active in legislative issues, a worker in the Republican party and a member of the Women's Legislative Council in Lake Owsego.

It is said of Mrs. Powers that "... she understands the philosophy of preservation—the saving of buildings and historical sites for use, not for private pleasure, but rather in terms of public good."

All of Gamma Phi Beta salutes this talented, energetic woman of many accomplishments.

Wisconsin

On May 14, forty-seven pledges and three special initiates of the Gamma Rho colony at Wisconsin State University—Oshkosh officially became the eighty-second Greek letter chapter of Gamma Phi Beta. The ceremony took place at the Presbyterian Church of Oshkosh under the direction of Mrs. John C. Trussell, director of expansion, and the installation team, Gamma, from the University of Wisconsin.

At the Installation Banquet on Saturday evening, Mrs. Graeme Reid, International Grand President, presented the charter for the new group to chapter president, Jane Jacobson. The Gamma Rho chapter of Gamma Phi Beta is the fifth NPC chapter on the Oshkosh campus. It originally was a local sorority founded in 1921 for the purpose of promoting dramatic interests on the campus. Until last year there were no NPC groups on the campus, however great gains have been made in this direction during the past year and now all the groups belong to NPC.

Wisconsin State University—Oshkosh has a long and distinguished academic history having served the needs of higher education in Wisconsin for nearly a century. The State Normal School enrolling its first students in 1871 became a State Teachers College in 1925. Upon the approval of curricula in the liberal arts in 1949, the school became Wisconsin State College—Oshkosh. A period of rapid growth in enrollment and programs followed in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

Recognizing the growth of the institution and the inauguration of several graduate programs, the college was designated as Wisconsin State University—Oshkosh in July, 1964. Enrollment at the University at the present time is approximately 10,000 students.

New Chapter House Dedicated In Colorado Springs

Alpha Phi chapter of Gamma Phi Beta at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, chartered in October 1932, now boasts the newest of the sorority houses on campus.

Sheltered by tall trees and protected from the street by a high wall, the black-shuttered white brick traditional building adheres to the mood of the English traditional campus. The new house replaces a center which was built in 1934 and which was used until 1962 when it was razed to make room for a campus sport complex.

Completed in May, 1965 and dedicated last fall, Alpha Phi's new home was designed by Wayne P. Cooper, Colorado Springs architect and husband of Gamma Phi Beta Ellie Cooper. The outstanding feature of the new building is the spacious reception room with its Georgian fireplace and French doors opening onto a terrace and sunken garden facing the base of Pike's Peak.

On the first floor is the reception room, housemother's apartment, a formal dining room, kitchen, study, powder room and a formal staircase leading to a lower level. The staircase is accented by a chandelier of green and turquoise.

The lower floor of the two-level building houses a cheery paneled chapter-recreation room with a natural brick fireplace, a kitchenette, the chapter president's office, powder room and storage space.

The collegiate and alumnæ chapters worked closely with the house corporation board members to make the new house possible. Members of the house board are Mrs. Harry W. 



CORRESPONDING SECRETARY:

By June 1, or as soon as information is available, send one college and rushing calendar on Form #G1-241b to Central Office and one to Province Collegiate Director.

By October 1 unless otherwise notified, send Grand President business for consideration at fall council meeting; include business for consideration of convention, in fall preceding convention.

Immediately after pledging (immediately after opening of college if pledging is deferred), send lists of chapter members and pledges (new and holdovers) to Central Office and Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241c and Form #G1-241d.

By February 15, send list of chapter members and pledges (new and holdovers) to Central Office and Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241c and Form #G1-241d.

By February 25, send Grand President business for consideration

at spring council meeting.

By March 15, send list of members who will graduate and members not returning to college to Province Collegiate Director, Province Alumnæ Director and Central Office.

As soon as information is available, send list of new chapter officers to Central Office and one list to Province Collegiate Director on Form #G1-241e.
