# **ΓΦB Brings Sunshine To Valley Of The Sun**

#### Bienvenidos!

With sisterhood in the air, smiling faces abounded at the 60th Gamma Phi Beta Convention which convened the last week in July in Phoenix. Hugs and shouts of delight were heard at the opening dinner as members made their way to chapter tables. It was only the beginning of an overwhelming display of five days of pride and commitment in Gamma Phi Beta.

#### Grand President's Message

Accomplishments and changes in the Sorority for the past biennium were noted and a challenge for the future was issued by Grand President Karen Wander Kline (Iowa St.) at the opening business session.

During the biennium, the Opportunity Fund was established to finance additional Gamma Phi Beta programs and services through donations by alumnae. As a result, a new expansion

presentation has been developed "to better convey the Gamma Phi Beta story," Mrs. Kline said.

Several province boundaries were moved and a second province XIII alumnae director and a second province XVI collegiate director were added to more equally distribute the workload among the officers. This was the result of a resolution adopted at the 1980 Convention considering realignment of the provinces.

A new name for chapter development was selected, based on a suggestion by Eta Chapter at the University of California. PACE—Personal and Chapter Enrichment—better defines the program's role in "providing chapter programming, public relations, problem solving and a total education beyond the classroom for both collegians and alumnae," Mrs. Kline said.

Collegiate delegates were reminded of a resolution adopted at the 1980

Convention which directed that their inspiration week and pledge programs be free from hazing. Mrs. Kline then emphasized that "all forms of hazing will be removed from the pledge program of each and every chapter, even if it means revoking a chapter's charter."

#### Ad Hoc Committees

The first of two ad hoc committees established during the biennium was, appointed to study the Sorority's legacy policy and rush education. "The committee reaffirms that special consideration for legacies include careful and courteous deliberation for each known legacy; that one courtesy invitation after the first round of parties' be extended for each rushee having a completed voluntary sponsor form on file with the chapter; that alumnae chapters and individual alumnae be thanked for submitting sponsor forms and notified regarding the rushee's status following rush," said Mrs. Kline. She continued by asking collegians to be sure to use the same membership selection criteria for legacies as is used for other rushees.

The second ad hoc committee began its task of developing a long range plan for Gamma Phi Beta by forecasting the future. "Today we are beginning to see a more socially responsible attitude. There is a greater desire for close personal relationships, a greater desire to belong. Self-fulfillment is still important—but not at all costs. Traditional values are returning—the values of friendship, sharing, caring, accepting responsibility, commitment and loyalty. The same values upon which Gamma Phi Beta was founded 108 years ago," said Mrs. Kline.

They also saw the unpredictable economy as the most important factor affecting Gamma Phi Beta's future. The decline of college enrollments, the increase in the number of women students, the population shift from the northeast and northern midwest and the increasing number of choices available to women were other factors considered by the long range planning committee. With these thoughts in mind, the committee defined and addressed itself to four areas—finance, recruitment, retention and expansion.



#### Finance

"Although Gamma Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is a sisterhood, it is also a business," Mrs. Kline said. "As such the planning committee feels it must be managed according to accepted business practices."

An increase in the number of alumnae paying taxes and the number of collegians paying membership fees is imperative in order for the Sorority to continue to provide the programs and services expected by members of Gamma Phi Beta. The committee recommended that the fee and tax structure be evaluated and endorsed the expansion of a merchandising program. Gamma Phi Beta Christmas tree ornaments will continue to be sold as will other items with Gamma Phi Beta letters on them such as shorts, notepads and T-shirts. "Encourage your members to buy these items from Gamma Phi Beta. Help augment Gamma Phi Beta's revenue rather than the local vendor's," said Mrs. Kline.

It is recommended that the Sorority's administrative structure and the functions of Grand Council be reviewed and reorganized if necessary to ensure efficiency and effectiveness and to maximize returns. A proposal to schedule longer collegiate consultant chapter and rush visits will necessitate the training of additional alumnae to act as rush advisor teams and to aid in officer transition.

Toward the goal of a strong future for Gamma Phi Beta, the committee recommended that minimum standards for healthy chapters be established and enforced. These standards would identify chapters in need of special assistance and serve as a means for self-evaluation and improvement.

The committee advised that an audio-visual library be developed for leadership training and that investigation continue into the feasibility of a combined Gamma Phi Beta owned Central Office/conference center/camp.

"If Gamma Phi Beta is to remain a viable force in society," Mrs. Kline said, "The committee feels it must grow in both quality and quantity of members. Growth is the result of successful recruitment. Recruitment to the collegiate chapter means rush. To the alumnae group it means attracting alumnae who are not involved and alumnae initiates to alumnae chapter activities."

The continued building and communication of an image that enhances pride in membership and the importance of a "365 day rush" are recommendations to attract and retain strong members.

"One of Gamma Phi Beta's greatest strengths lies in the diverse backgrounds, attitudes and skills of its members. Gamma Phi Beta is diverse because it offers innovative and progressive programming—programming the committee suggests be continued and expanded to keep attracting an increasingly diverse female population—programming worthy of the expenditure of time and money," said Mrs. Kline.

#### Retention

"Very closely related to recruitment is retention. Based on the premise that once a woman has pledged, the Gamma Phi Beta experience should foster a lifetime commitment, the long range planning committee concurs with Grand Council that development of lifelong, participating alumnae begins in the pledge program."

The result of this recommendation is a new pledge program designed to instill "P and C in G Phi B"—"Pride and Commitment in Gamma Phi Beta." Continued expanded programming "aimed at the retention of all ages of Gamma Phi Betas, the freshman as

well as the senior, the young alumna as well as the slightly older sister, and all those in between" also will encourage a lifetime commitment.

"The committee feels that offering university accredited continuing education units for leadership training should be continued, as should emphasis on the ritual ceremonies and their meanings," Mrs. Kline said. "And, training programs of interest to both collegians and alumnae, employing video equipment, for use locally and regionally should be developed.

Because active, involved alumnae are excellent role models, the plan proposes that more emphasis be placed on the integration of alumnae/collegiate activities at times other than rush week, Founders Day or initiation. Opportunities and ideas for collegiate/ alumnae involvement for non-sponsoring alumnae groups should be increased, and collegiate chapters needing extra support should be matched with non-sponsoring alumnae groups in addition to sponsoring groups."

Mrs. Kline said, "It is also suggested that local career nights be expanded and that Grand Council investigate ways Gamma Phi Beta can provide career assistance. How do you translate Gamma Phi Beta skills into marketable job skills? Would a career bank or ca-

reer network be practical?

"The planning committee feels that Gamma Phi Beta must make the possibility of volunteer leadership roles, including Grand Council positions, feasible for all alumnae—those women who are employed full-time, as well as those who are not. The workload of each officer should be examined, and the use of Central Office increased to alleviate as much of this workload as possible. All volunteer positions should be well-defined and meaningful, and each volunteer should be provided the means needed to perform her duties efficiently and effectively."

The recommendation that Gamma Phi Beta be more aggressive in the establishment of collegiate chapters and alumnae groups is, the committee feels, as important to international Gamma Phi Beta as rush and the alumnae initiate program are to the Sorority's chapters. To aid in alumnae expansion, the office of assistant to the Alumnae Vice President-Alumnae

Expansion was established during the biennium.

Mrs. Kline concluded her presentation by challenging every member "to take the opportunity: make Gamma Phi Beta the very best that it can be; truly strive to develop the highest type of womanhood."

#### NPC Luncheon

Presided over by National Panhellenic Conference Delegate Gloria Swanson Nelson (SMU), the luncheon featured a speech on alcoholism by Dr. Thomas Goodale, vice chancellor of student affairs at the University of Denver, and a Sigma Alpha Epsilon. He brought a challenge to Gamma Phi Betas to deal directly with alcohol abuse through education of members. "Prohibition is not the answer," he said. "Abuse, not use leads to trouble." He challenged the Sorority to continue its policy of decrying abuse of alcohol and to continue the education program dealing with alcoholism.

Shocking the assembled sisters and their Phoenix Panhellenic guests, Dr. Goodale showed two rush posters lifted from campus bulletin boards. Both focused on "beer bashes," "Bourbon Street (spend the night in the gutter)," and keg parties, with no mention of brotherhood or fellowship, or even the word fraternity used.

He urged that alcohol not be the focus of any party; that food be available, as well as soft drinks. "The social pressure to drink is enormous," he said.

Dr. Goodale reported on a student formed group entitled BACCHUS, acronym for Boost Alcohol Consciousness and Concern for the Health of University Students. Bacchus was the Greek god of wine. Its focus is education and peer examples of intelligent, moderate alcohol use.

He said a good thing to remember is HALT: Don't use alcohol when you're Hungry, Angry, Lonely, Tired.

The Panhellenic luncheon was also the scene for the presentation of the Carnation Award for outstanding professional and volunteer achievements outside the Sorority which reflect admirably on Gamma Phi Beta. Peggy Boothe Mensinger (Stanford) was honored. She is the current mayor of Modesto, Calif.

#### Continuing Education

Conventioneers participated in leadership training classes for which they earned continuing education credit from Arizona State University. Taught by university personnel, the topics ranged from study skills to nonverbal communication to financial planning. Selling vourself and Gamma Phi Beta was the subject of one class taught by Gamma Phi Betas Jadie McClung Hall, Ph.D., Connie Metcalf Copenhaver, Ph.D. and Connie Gregg (all Arizona). Credit for Gamma Phi Beta leadership training was first granted at the 1980 Denver Convention.

#### Workshops

Gamma Phi Beta international officers presented a wealth of Sorority information in workshops throughout the week. Pledge directors and advisors attended afternoon sessions, learning about the Sorority's new pledge program. Beautiful new manuals for pledges and pledge directors were introduced.

Other workshops featured the TranSISter Service, Mother's Clubs, rush, rush recommendations and PACE. They all afforded conventioneers an opportunity to exchange ideas with other members and to learn how to better incorporate the Sorority's programs.

#### Grand Canyon

Clad in an array of Gamma Phi Beta T-shirts, conventioneers boarded 11 buses bound for the Grand Canyon at 7 a.m. one morning. Upon arrival, hearty Gamma Phi Betas trekked down the Canyon in half the time it took them to return to the top. After four hours in the beauty of the Grand Canvon, conventioneers boarded their buses for a ride through the pines to Flagstaff and the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation dinner.

#### Foundation Dinner

After a barbeque dinner hosted by Flagstaff alumnae, members watched a black and white movie from the early days of Gamma Phi Beta camping in Vancouver and a slide show of today's Gamma Phi Beta Camp Sechelt. The 50th anniversary of the Vancouver Camp Board will be celebrated in Van-(continued on p. 9)

couver on November 10. Camping Chairman Jennie Curtis (N. Arizona) announced that 144 children were sent to local camps and 108 children to Camp Sechelt in the past year.

Members were reminded that any chapter or individual may establish a named scholarship or fellowship fund to be administered by the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation. Lambda Chapter House Corporation has begun its efforts for a fund which will honor a particular individual each year.

#### Memorial Service

The memorial service and the exemplification of the ritual were presented by members of Beta Kappa Chapter at Arizona State University under the direction of Cindy Partain Farrell (Bowling Green), International Ritual Chairman. Kathy Creswell Johnson (N. Arizona), Convention Ritual Chairman, assisted in the presentations.

Director of Finance Mary Jane Hipp Misthos (Colorado College) read a tribute to the late Penelope Murdoch Simonson. Mrs. Simonson was initiated into Eta Chapter at the University of California and served as Grand President from 1946 to 1950. Named to the Honor Roll for originating and implementing the Loyalty Pledge, she was also Alumnae Vice President, Director of Finance and National Panhellenic Conference Delegate.

The explanation of the ritual at both the model initiation and the opening business session increased the members' awareness of the complex meanings of both services. Cindy Farrell said the ideas exemplified in the ritual are ones by which to live our lives today, 108 years after the Sorority's founding.

#### Hall of Fame

The Dallas Alumnae Chapter was the recipient of the coveted Hall of Fame award which recognizes 10 years of overall excellence. Previous winners of the prestigious award are the Greater Kansas City, Houston and Philadelphia North Suburban Alumnae Chapters.

Ladyfood, a cookbook compiled and distributed by the Dallas Alumnae Chapter is available to chapters as a fund raising tool. For each book sold, a chapter makes a two dollar profit and one dollar is donated to the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation. #### Resolutions

Resolutions adopted at the final business session called for:-Grand Council to form a committee to investigate ways of providing financial support for Slightly Older Sisters (SOS) who may find themselves without family members to assist them with their personal financial needs.-the membership to support the new magazine agency in Central Office (see ad on p. 20).-each pledge to have her own copy of the new pledge manual.—the encouragement of every collegiate chapter to pledge and initiate 100 percent of Panhellenic quota.-every collegiate chapter to rid their pledge practices of hazing.—Grand Council to investigate and implement, if feasible, the hiring of a public relations firm to help build and communicate an image that enhances pride in membership.—Grand Council to reconsider the timing and number of statements of alumnae taxes and Opportunity Fund contributions because of confusion and loss of income to local alumnae chapters.—the Research Committee to evaluate alumnae membership fees and taxes and the necessity of establishing a single alumnae tax.

# Fellowship and Scholarship Winners Named For 1982-83

Lindsey Barbee Fellowship

Christina Elena Tanner (McGill) graduated last spring with a Bachelor of Civil Law degree. She plans to complete a second law degree, the LL.B, in 1983 and to then pursue a degree in medicine. With the achievement of these ambitions, she will be qualified to pursue her career interest of medical law.

"Medical law is a vast field of tremendous social importance," Christina said. "Its breadth is far more encompassing than simply the 'malpractice issues' that immediately come to mind. # Alcoholism . . . It May

My dear sister in Gamma Phi Beta:

I am a recovered alcoholic and drug addict. I am writing to you in memory of my oldest friend's mother, a beautiful, vivacious Delta Gamma, who died of alcoholism. I also think of my own dear mother, a warm, gifted Gamma Phi Beta, who died a recovered alcoholic. Evidently, I am the only Gamma Phi Beta who responded to the article in the winter issue of THE CRESCENT, and, frankly, I am scared to death. But, if you read the 20 questions in the article and answered them as honestly as you could and said "yes" to even one question, I hold my hand out to you with hope, because it may not be necessary for you to suffer as I had to.

Alcoholism and drug addiction are an all too common, often misunderstood disease. Yes, the American Medical Association has established this disease as one of a two-fold nature: a physical compulsion plus a mental obsession which is "cunning, baffling, and powerful." While you may think of drugs as only those used illegally (and there are answers for that also), doctors on a routine basis, daily prescribe various forms of mood-altering medication which, just as alcohol, can lead to dependence and then addiction. Thus, I have the dual problem for which the only answer is abstinence. I can't take one drink or one pill, because it could lead to a chain reaction which could start the whole problem again. Because addiction is progressive, I have to think of the grief and misery that would once again be caused by my carelessness.

Some have suffered more than I; some less. Some die; some go insane.

It has been necessary for me, in finding sobriety, to use psychiatry, religion and Alcoholics Anonymous. It has worked for me and I can only relate my own experience. Everyone is different. All professional and lay people in the fields of alcoholism and drug abuse agree on one premise. To be fully healed there has to be a deep displacement of self, a conversion, a complete change of thinking.

Alcoholics Anonymous has been the most successful program in overcom-

ing alcoholism. For drug addicts there is the relatively new Narcotics Anonymous. An information program on addiction pioneered at Eisenhower Medical Center in Rancho Mirage, Calif., is growing, with more than 100 groups throughout the country. Every city in the nation has its own resource groups.

In Alcoholics Anonymous there are 12 suggested steps to follow, and, in practicing these steps to the best of your ability, there is relief, sobriety, and even serenity. However, you have to honestly admit you have a problem, try to keep an open mind, and be willing to follow the steps. The 12th step is "Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics and to practice these principles in all our affairs." All I am doing now is making a 12th step call. I am doing this because I love Gamma Phi Beta, and any Gamma Phi Beta, a member of her family, or someone she knows just might be helped.

In retrospect, I don't know when my problem began. In college I drank "differently" from anyone else, but at the time it wasn't important, because I

was just too full of life.

When I married my husband, he and I enjoyed several years of solid drinking, but we knew something was wrong, and we didn't know what to do about it. We had four beautiful children, fortunately all normal, but my last child had to be withdrawn from the toxicants in my system when he was born. I passed it off, but I was ashamed and humiliated within myself. When my second child was on the way my doctor gave me one of the then new tranquilizers to be taken four times a day. During all my pregnancies I drank alcohol and took pills until I eventually crossed over the "invisible border"into alcoholism and drug addiction. Many thousands of dollars were spent to "cure" me, but I hadn't "hit bottom." I was in state institutions and private sanitariums. I was in and out of Alcoholics Anonymous for years-years of shame, guilt, and hurt to those dearest to me; but it is said that once the seed of Alcoholics Anonymous is planted, there is no turning

back, and I believe this to be true. Alcoholics Anonymous ruins your drinking, and it is impossible to make an alcoholic a social drinker.

If this letter speaks to you, I would like to hear from you. I remain anonymous, but for you, I am your sister in Gamma Phi Beta, with all that means, because we have a very precious tie.

In closing I want to end with a simple "thank you" to the one person in my life, among many, who has helped me the most—my wise and wonderful father, a Phi Gamma Delta, who has suffered when I have suffered, who knows me better than I know myself.

No words in any language can express my gratitude to this remarkable man, who, when I was initiated into Gamma Phi Beta, sent me 30 dozen pink carnations!

# Women Drinking As Much As Men

In a recent study conducted at the University of Vermont, it was found that 25.9 percent of the students surveyed were drinking more than last year; 67.4 percent drank at least once a week; 70.7 percent associated drinking with "having a good time."

Alcohol use is a part of the social pattern in American society, and the college campus is no exception. Today's students are concerned with success after graduation. A high percentage of them are putting tremendous stress on themselves to get good grades; often they have achievement expectations far above their abilities, and when they are not able to live up to these expectations, problems such as excessive drinking, alcohol dependence, or even suicide (the leading cause of death among college students in 1981) arise.

Women's drinking habits have changed so drastically in the last several decades that they now drink as much and as often as men. A Greek letter chapter can do much to help fight alcohol abuse. The role of Greek organizations, suggests University of Vermont's Dean of Students Dr. Keith Miser, is to offer a program of education—a program dependent on shared responsibilities among international fraternity organizations, local chapters, alumnae and institutions.

According to the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism, we are a drinking people. Seven of 10 adult Americans drink alcoholic beverages at least occasionally. Why do we drink? The Institute says: "In our way of life there are immense social pressures exerted on people to use alcoholcocktail parties, business luncheons. People choose to drink to celebrate, to melt tension, to ease physical or emotional pain, to escape feelings of worry, boredom, and inferiority. Young people, on the other hand, may drink primarily because they want to do adult things."

John D. Lovern, Ph.D., psychologist at Jerry L. Pettis Memorial Hospital in California, writes that the disturbing fact is that every member of our society is a candidate for some kind of alcohol-related tragedy, either personally or because someone we love has died or been disabled due to alcohol related problems.

Recognizing "there is no way of making an alcoholic into a social drinker," Joanne has offered a life line to any Gamma Phi Beta sister, collegian or alumna, who may be suffering from an alcohol related problem: whether she is already an alcoholic, a potential alcoholic, or has to deal with alcoholics.

# Widowed By War, Sister Urges Pressure For POW-MIA Accounting

A subject close to the heart of Janis Ostrom Dodge (Oregon) is the release of American prisoners still held in Southeast Asia.

Jan's husband, Cdr. Ronald W. Dodge, U.S.N., was captured in North Vietnam in May, 1967. Last summer his body was one of three returned to the United States—one of three of the 2,500 unaccounted for POW-MIAs about whom Hanoi withholds information. Formal U.S. military involvement ended in Southeast Asia more than nine years ago, but 1,400 American servicemen and civilians remain officially listed as prisoners of war, and 1,200 are listed as killed in action, body not recovered.

The principle organization working for their release is the National League of Families of Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia. Jan became active in the League in 1979, after being a member for years. She said, "I felt as most Americans do that every effort was being made by our government to account for those who did not return. Few people entertained the thought that there might be live American prisoners left behind or that Vietnamese and Laotians may be holding remains of Americans as bargaining chips."

But, as Southeast Asian refugees began coming out, they brought with them stories of Americans still in prison and of remains being held in Hanoi. Now there are almost 400 first-hand live sightings. In addition, CIA documents confirm the existence of 44 prison camps in Laos, many of which reportedly held American POWs.

Convinced that remains were being

doled out to the United States when it was advantageous to the Socialist Republic of Vietnam to do so, Jan stepped up her activity by serving on the board of directors of the National League of Families in 1980 and 1981. She also participated on local and national television news and interview programs including ABC World News Tonight, Nightline, Tonight and Hour Magazine. The object was to try to make the public more aware of the plight of the missing and their families so pressure would be put on our government to resolve the issue.

Jan's story is typical, according to Parade Magazine. Cdr. Dodge was part of a planned air attack on the Dao My highway bridge in Quang Binh province, North Vietnam. Before reaching the target, his F-8E suffered mechanical trouble or was hit by flak, and Dodge bailed out and landed safely.

The Navy immediately listed my husband as "captured," Jan said, because he spoke to his wingman from the ground. He said he was moving up the hill, being surrounded, and breaking up his radio. Hanoi radio announced the next day that they had captured an "American bandit." He was the only American pilot down that day.

Four months later on September 9, 1967, Paris Match magazine printed a photograph of Dodge moments after his capture. An East German propaganda film later featured footage of Dodge being taken into custody by Vietnamese militia.

"Obviously, he was alive," Jan said.

"But when North Vietnam released its list of prisoners, his name wasn't on it." Discouraged, she flew to Paris in May, 1970, and confronted the Vietnamese delegate to the Paris peace conference. She showed him the picture from *Paris Match* which subsequently became a symbol for the effort by families of prisoners and missing. The delegate looked flabbergasted, Jan said, but said if her husband wasn't on the list, they didn't have him.

Last summer's events, 11 years later, proved otherwise. Only then did the Hanoi government deem it beneficial to return the remains of three pilots. Public interest was again briefly stirred, "but pressure is still needed," Jan said. "The Communist Vietnamese have on occasion remarked that if the American people don't even care, why should they bother to 'hunt' for remains?"

To date, there has been an accounting for only 78 men. In view of the increasingly convincing evidence that Vietnam is withholding POWs and the substantiated data proving they could account for hundreds of dead, the National League of POW/MIA Families has initiated a "Write Hanoi" campaign.

And this is where everyone can help, Jan said. Letters showing that Americans will not accept using our servicemen and civilians as pawns in an attempt to extort reparations may be sent to Senators and Representatives as well as to the Vietnamese Ambassador to the United Nations, Ha Van Lau, 20 Waterside Plaza, New York, NY 10010. 


