The First At Colgate

Alpha Chapter at Syracuse University assisted in the November 14, 1981 installation of Gamma Phi Beta's 115th chapter, Delta Tau. Gamma Phi Beta is the first National Panhellenic Conference sorority on the Colgate University campus in Hamilton, N.Y.

During the eight week pledge period, the 22 colony members and 10 alumnae initiates received guidance from Expansion Supervisor Nancy Donovan (Bowling Green), Betty Kroupa Rembert (Vanderbilt), Financial Advisor Nancy Crowe Heck (Bowling Green) and Alumnae Field Representative Gretchen Meier Oostenink (Iowa). Delta Tau collegians Barbara Sampson and Lynn Sikes served as the colony's pledge directors.

The festivities began Friday evening when international officers visited the collegians at the chapter house. On Saturday afternoon, the initiation ceremony

was performed by collegians from Syracuse and Rutgers. International Ritual Co-chairman Cindy Partain (Bowling Green) and Collegiate Consultant Mary Neel (Drake) coordinated the presentation of the ritual.

Province Alumnae Director Dorothy Roberts Matheson (Boston) was mistress of ceremonies at the initiation banquet Saturday evening. Parents, alumnae and special guests joined in the celebration.

Grand President Karen Wander Kline (Iowa St.) welcomed Delta Tau Chapter, shared some memories of Gamma Phi Beta and presented the chapter's charter to President Barbara Cleveland.

The Grand Council gift, a silver punch bowl, was presented by Director of Expansion Mary Alice Adams Betts (William and Mary). The chapter's historic 1913 president's badge

Boise alumnae had reason to be proud at the Area Leadership Conference in Tacoma when they were named the outstanding alumnae chapter. Not that they haven't been proud before, because perhaps pride above all else is one of the strongest ties of their chapter.

Pride in their Gamma Phi Beta sisterhood, pride in the collegians who hail from the Boise area, pride in the members of Delta Beta Chapter at Boise State University with whom they are so closely associated, and pride in the outstanding community achievements of the members themselves. As evidence of this pride, activities throughout the year enjoy a constant high rate of attendance.

The chapter was founded in 1939. Its membership was comprised largely of alumnae from Xi Chapter at the University of Idaho, but through the years many chapters have been represented in the group. With the founding of Beta Iota Chapter at Idaho State University in 1949 and Delta Beta Chapter on the Boise State University campus in 1970, the alumnae group has continued to thrive due to the welcome addition of these new young alumnae.

The close proximity of Delta Beta Chapter has given the Boise alumnae many opportunities to offer assistance. From the Greek letter chapter's inception, the alumnae have been actively involved.

Decorating the chapter house by sanding, painting, hanging curtains and pictures, finding furniture, beds, and kitchen items was a big task, but one which was thoroughly appreciated by the Delta Beta members. The formation of the house corporation was soon accomplished by alumnae who still serve gladly wherever needed.

Food is an item which collegians always appreciate and alumnae are hap-

py to provide it for fall rush parties as well as supplying a complete dinner one night each month.

A vacuum cleaner, silver service pieces and a dining room table are a few of the items which alumnae have been able to provide Delta Beta Chapter the last few years. With each spring graduation come new alumnae and those of us in Boise welcome their addition to our group.

What To Do About Legacies

Again this fall, many young women will be arriving on our campuses with sweet dreams of wearing the pledge pin of Gamma Phi Beta as their sister, mother or grandmother did. When these dreams become reality, it is a joy for everyone concerned. When they are dashed, it becomes a nightmare.

In general, legacies have been exposed to the traditions, lasting friendships and opportunities of membership through Gamma Phi Beta by their family relationships. Most make excellent life-time members because of this background. But as the numbers of legacies increase, so do the number of disappointments. Results of a recent survey conducted by Gamma Phi Beta show that particularly at our older chapters the number of legacy rushees sometimes exceeds the available openings in the pledge class. Therefore, sheer numbers cause many disappointments.

Our sorority policy concerning legacies states a sister, daughter or granddaughter of a Gamma Phi Beta shall be given *special consideration* for membership. Special consideration refers to courteous, fair and serious deliberation concerning her membership, taking into account her background interest and possible loyalty to the sorority. It does not mean a guarantee of membership.

In an effort to better prepare for and profit from legacy situations, the following suggestions are given for alumnae and collegians. The fault in disappointing situations does not lie solely on one side or the other. *Cooperation, open communication and common courtesies must be our guidelines.*

To the alumnae, be sure a completed Sponsor Form (recommendation) for your legacy has been sent to the collegiate chapter in time for use before rush. If you or your friends would like to send a personal note and/or the legacy introduction form printed on p. 14, do so early. Do not assume that the collegiate chapter will automatically be aware of your legacy.

Discuss not only Gamma Phi Beta but the total Greek system with your legacy. All Panhellenic sororities have

similar goals and ideals. Times change and chapters change but the Greek system as a whole has continued to be a compliment to formal education. It is a disservice to any legacy to apply such pressure that she thinks only Gamma Phi Beta can give her a meaningful collegiate and alumna experience. Disappointments are even greater.

Some collegiate chapters hold legacy weekends or special events. Some do not and/or cannot because of rushing regulations. Investigate the policy at your legacy's campus. Encourage her to attend if that option is available. It is a valuable way for her to get to know the Gamma Phi Betas and for them to meet her prior to rush.

Do not expect the collegiate chapter to compromise any of the standards of membership for your legacy. Scholastic ability, character and financial responsibility will be assessed equally for legacies and all other rushees.

To the collegians, be true to our "special consideration" policy. Review and evaluate each legacy as an individual keeping in mind her prior knowledge of Gamma Phi Beta. Be fair—do not expect more or less of her because of her family relationships.

Be sure your chapter abides by the policy that all known legacies be issued an invitation to the first set of invitational parties. Also, it is recommended that legacies be considered for membership prior to the set of parties *preceding* the final party. If they are not to receive an invitation to pledge, they will have an opportunity to select another sorority.

Accept and consider information from Sponsor Forms. With increasing numbers of rushees on most campuses, this can be a very useful tool and extension of your chapter's knowledge concerning a rushee. It is also a very important means of identifying legacies.

Consider thoughtfully the feelings of others. A Gamma Phi Beta sister somewhere has sent you her most precious gift—her own sister, daughter or granddaughter. Deliberate carefully and courteously considering this wom-

an. By losing a legacy, Gamma Phi Beta may not only lose a pledge but a loyal alumna and a supportive family.

The responsibility and privilege for the future of Gamma Phi Beta rests with the collegiate chapters through membership selection. It is our goal to select the most outstanding pledges possible—pledges who will become members true to our life-time commitment. Legacies can and should be a part of this goal.

The Greek rushing system is a selection process. Every rushee must be aware of this element in rush and willing to accept the results. Alumnae must also recognize and be tolerant of decisions made during this selection process. Alumnae have all enjoyed the privilege of selecting future sisters during their collegiate years. This right has now passed to the current collegiate members.

The task is clear. Alumnae and collegians must work together, be tolerant, have faith in judgment and be willing to communicate for the mutual benefit of the sisterhood we both love and respect. Gamma Phi Beta needs the support and cooperation of all its members.
