A busy and exciting spring and fall in the expansion department culminated with the pledging of four new colonies. On April 10, 1983, Beta Sigma Alpha local at Oakland University in Rochester, Mich. became Delta Omega colony of Gamma Phi Beta. That same day rush began at the University of California-Santa Barbara and ended with the pledging of Delta Psi colony on April 14. And, on May 1, Epsilon Alpha was colonized with the pledging of a local at La Salle College in Philadelphia, Penn. (Story about Epsilon Beta colony at Texas Woman's University is on page 6.)

Oakland

Oakland University was founded in 1957 when the late Alfred and Matilda Dodge Wilson donated their 1,500 acre estate and \$2 million to Michigan State University to begin a new college. Michigan State University-Oakland was established in 1959. In 1963, its name was changed to Oakland University, and in 1970 the State Legislature granted Oakland its independence.

The natural beauty of the campus, much of it still wooded and undeveloped, is enhanced by comprehensive recreational facilities and modern university buildings. Complementing Oakland's academic program is a major public service program which emphasizes the professional performing arts. Meadow Brook Music Festival is the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and Meadow Brook Hall, home of the university's benefactors, now serves as a conference and cultural center. Anchored by a strong liberal arts program, the university is made up of a College of Arts and Sciences; Schools of Economics and Management, Engineering, Human and Educational Services, Nursing and Performing Arts; a Center of Health Sciences; and a Division of Continuing Education.

Pledging was held in the ballroom of Meadow Brook Hall. The service was conducted by Beta Chapter, University of Michigan. Province Collegiate Director IV Betty Ahlmeyer Quick (Indiana) assisted. Alumnae from Detroit, Birmingham and Rochester attended, and Beta Delta Chapter at Michigan State sent Gamma Phi Beta key chains, made especially for the event, to the 18 happy new pledges. Fall rush brought the colony 20 more pledges.

Gamma Phi Beta joins Alpha Delta Pi and Phi Sigma Sigma national sororities and Theta Chi national fraternity in a relatively new Greek system.

Santa Barbara

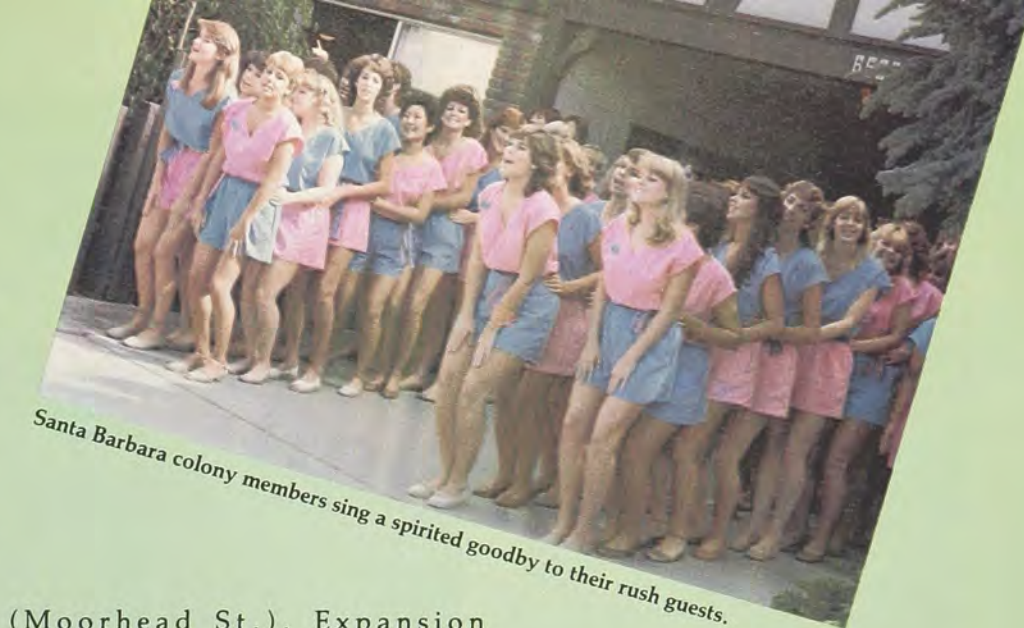
After four days of colonization by rushing, Delta Psi colony was pledged at the Christ Lutheran Church in Goleta. Delta Theta Chapter, California Polytechnic State-San Luis Obispo, conducted the pledge ceremony.

Surrounded by posters, banners, balloons and flyers, Gamma Phi Beta began its colonization on April 10. An informational gathering hosted by Beta Lambda Chapter, San Diego State, was held at the Alpha Delta Pi house. Two days of open house parties were held at the Lambda Chi Alpha house and on Tuesday evening Delta Theta Chapter performed its Disneyland skit at an informal party at the Kappa Kappa Gamma house. On Wednesday evening the San Luis Obispo collegians hosted a formal preference dessert at the Faculty Club on campus.

After pledging, a dinner was given by the Santa Barbara alumnae in honor of their 59 excited new pledges at the house of Jane Bacheller Brillhart (Colorado St.), pledge advisor.

California, Pennsylvania, Michigan colonies join Gamma Phi Beta ranks

Responsible at the local level for organizing the many colonization activities was Lois Kirchner Abbott (San Jose St.), field representative and alumna advisor. Assisting her were the many supportive and enthusiastic Santa Barbara alumnae. Directing the activities was a colonization team of international officers headed by Karen Wander Kline (Iowa St.), Director of Expansion and assisted by Randy Stevens Guerra (Cal. St.-Long Beach), Collegiate Vice President; Barb Hurt (Kearney St.), Collegiate Consultant and Expansion Supervisor-Santa Barbara; Terri Telles (Cal. Gamma Phi Beta joins Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Delta Pi, Alpha Gamma Delta, Alpha Phi, Chi Omega, Delta Gamma, Kappa Alpha Theta, Kappa Delta, Kappa Kappa Gamma and Pi Beta Phi on campus.

The campus is situated on an 815 acre promontory on the Pacific Ocean with a view of the Santa Ynez mountain range. Unique to the University of California system is Santa Barbara's College of Creative Studies for students with a demonstrated talent for independent work in the arts, mathe-

matics or sciences. The university also has Colleges of Engineering and Letters and Science, a Graduate Division and Graduate School of Education.

La Salle

Gamma Phi Beta marked two firsts and passed a milestone in its history with the pledging of Epsilon Alpha colony at La Salle College on May 1, 1983. Gamma Phi Beta is the first National Panhellenic Conference sorority to colonize at La Salle, and Epsilon Alpha, when installed, will be the first "Epsilon" chapter of Gamma Phi Beta.

Pledging was conducted in the College Union by Delta Kappa Chapter from Lehigh University. An informal reception for the 33 elated pledges was attended by Lehigh collegians and

Philadelphia North Suburban alumnae. International officers present were Mary Jean Lauvetz Hart (Nebraska), Area Financial Advisor; Julia Hill Flinchbaugh (Penn St.), Province Alumnae Director II; Gwen Whitnell Egleston (Arizona), Province Collegiate Director II; and Debbie Foulsham Freisheim (Penn St.), International Nominating Committee Member.

After the reception, colony members led Lehigh collegians outside to announce the arrival of Gamma Phi Beta to the La Salle campus with songs and cheers. And, there were more cheers of excitement when the colony pledged 19 more women in the fall.

Founded by a group of Christian brothers, La Salle was chartered by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1863. It moved to its present location in 1929, purchasing part of the historic Belfield Farm, once the home of American painter Charles Willson Peale. The first women students were admitted in 1970, ending a century old tradition. Today women comprise approximately 40 percent of the 3,200 students.

Located on a pleasantly green and peaceful 50 acre tract in Philadelphia, La Salle has a somewhat suburban atmosphere while retaining the educational and cultural advantages of a large city. Architecturally, the buildings reflect the history of La Salle's growth, ranging from traditional collegiate Gothic to modern. Basically a liberal arts college, La Salle is committed primarily to undergraduate education.

Sorority life begins at Texas Woman's University

Epsilon Beta colony brings yet another first to Gamma Phi Beta. On September 4, 1983, after four days of intensive rushing, Gamma Phi Beta and Alpha Omicron Pi became the first two National Panhellenic Conference sororities on the Denton campus of Texas Woman's University (TWU).

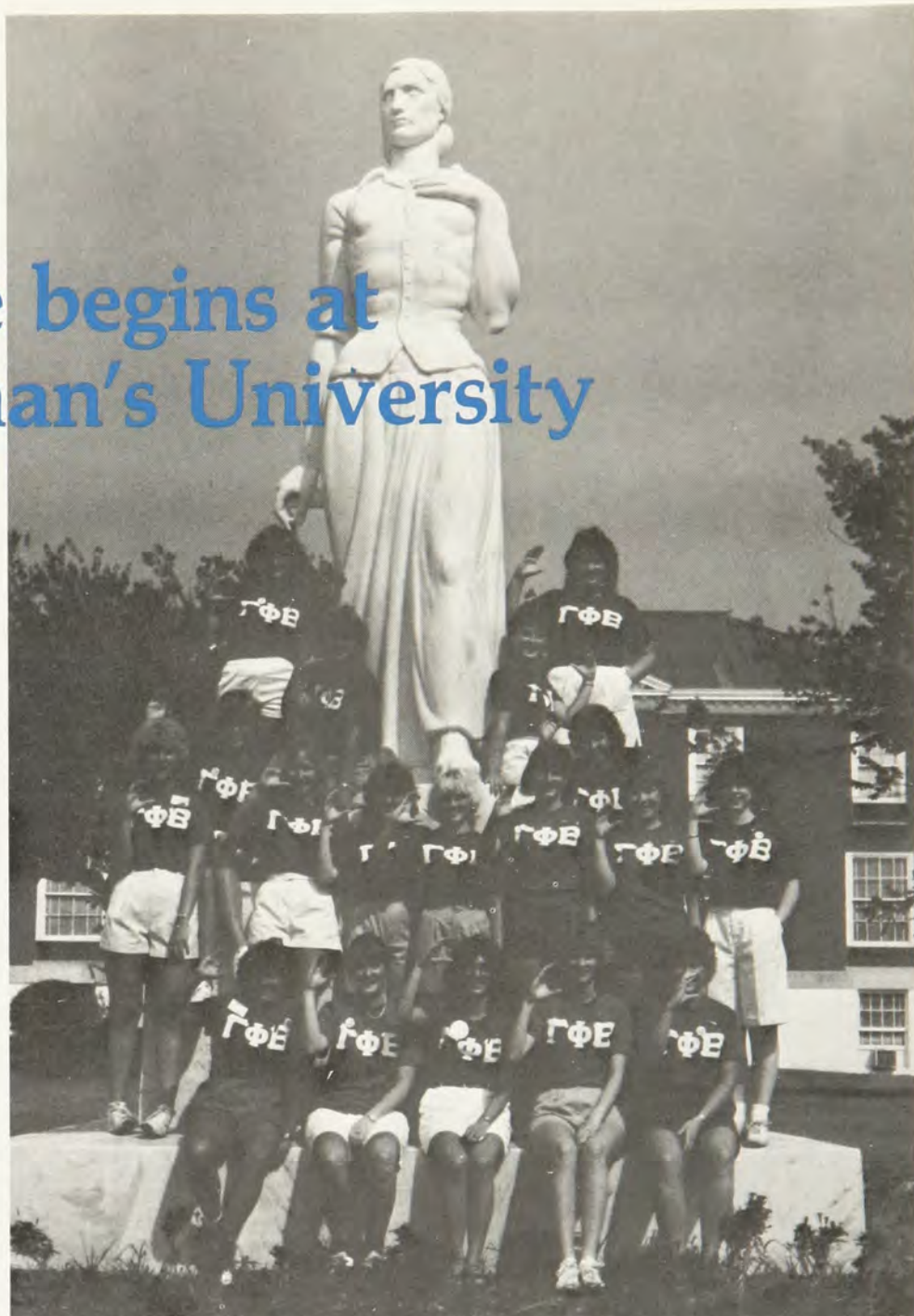
At the time of the founding of TWU in 1901, the higher education of women as well as education in vocational subjects were not accepted. Thus the Texas Legislature charged the new college with a dual mission—that of providing young women a literary education and preparing them “for the practical industries of the age.” This charge has guided TWU throughout its existence.

It has grown from a small college with one building, 14 faculty members and 186 students to a major metropolitan university with four campuses, more than 500 faculty members and more than 8,500 students—3,000 on the Denton campus alone.

Emphasizing careers for women, undergraduate instruction is offered in the Colleges of Natural and Social Sciences; Education; Humanities and Fine Arts; Health, Physical Education and Recreation; Nutrition, Textiles and Human Development; and Nursing. There are also Schools of Health Care Sciences, Library Science, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy.

With balloons, posters, flyers, bumper stickers and buttons, Gamma Phi Beta began its colonization by participating in a sorority information night. Two days of informal open houses, and a more formal preference dessert completed the colonization rush.

Serving on Gamma Phi Beta's colonization team were Karen Wander Kline (Iowa St.), Director of Expan-

sion; Gloria Swanson Nelson (Oklahoma), National Panhellenic Conference Delegate; Mary Fisher Griffith (S. Methodist), Province Alumnae Director VII; Marilyn Bachnik Callahan (Wisc.-Oshkosh), Province Collegiate Director VII; Joanne Shaffer (Rutgers), Collegiate Consultant and Expansion Supervisor-TWU; Julie Shafer (Oklahoma St.), Expansion Supervisor-Oakland; and Julie Lancaster (Nebraska), Expansion supervisor-La Salle. J.J. Stoll Kaelin (Colorado), International Song Chairman, and members of Alpha Zeta Chapter at the University of

Texas assisted with the preference party.

On Sunday afternoon, September 4, Epsilon Beta colony was formally pledged in the Student Center on campus. The ceremony conducted by Delta Epsilon Chapter, Texas Wesleyan College, was attended by alumnae from the Denton and Dallas areas. An informal reception honoring the 19 excited new pledges climaxed another successful colonization for Gamma Phi Beta. The colony continued the pattern of success by pledging seven more women.

'The best little organizer in the world'

Gladys Wilkinson Lawrence (Nebraska) is a woman whose life spans interests and accomplishments from running the family business to being founder and patron of many of Los Angeles' charities.

A widow who has lived in the same 17-room "Pink Palace" on Sunset Boulevard in Bel Air for more than 50 years, Mrs. Lawrence has traveled extensively (around the world 37 times) and danced at international balls in Vienna and Venice. She has also been comfortable as one of the "grande dames" of Los Angeles society, pouring tea for members of her many prestigious charity groups.

But it is the role of businesswoman of which Mrs. Lawrence is most proud. She and her husband came to Los Angeles in January, 1925, and shortly thereafter founded a company that manufactures heavy steel roll-up doors that are shipped to commercial establishments around the world. It is at this company, behind a well-worn desk her husband gave her years ago, that Mrs. Lawrence sits three days a week from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Actually, she retired because of failing eyesight three years ago, but that only means she stays home on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Not that Mrs. Lawrence had to go to work, even in the early days when the company was new. "I hated housework and preferred running the office and having a maid at home," she said. Her son, Paul William Lawrence, Jr., describes her as "the best little organizer in the world."

Organization is something that the women at the University of Nebraska

discovered in her early on, too. As a freshman Gamma Phi Beta, she realized that there were many lovely women who weren't sorority members. So, she became a one-woman Panhellenic. Getting out her copy of Baird's Manual (the book listing all Greek letter societies), she checked off the ones that weren't already on campus and wrote offering them the chance to form chapters at Nebraska. Some of them took her up on the offer.

The Lawrences had made the move to California after a miserably cold Iowa Christmas with no year-end bonus. The logical answer to this unhappiness was to relocate somewhere in a warm climate where her husband could be his own boss. During her first year there she had her first venture into the Los Angeles philanthropic scene. She rounded up her mother's friends and got them to help deliver Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets to the needy.

That was just the beginning. Groups who list her as founder include the Flower Guild, originally organized to sell plants, flowers, gifts, and put on plays to support a nursery school and later children who were patients at the county hospital. Flower Guild, now Flower Guild for Children's Charities, still assists at the hospital, now Los Angeles County-USC Medical Center. In 1956 the Flower Guild Players withdrew to go its own way as the Footlighters, a group that makes thousands of dollars each year with its Cabaret Ball and distributes money among various children's charities. Another group Mrs. Lawrence founded is the Los Angeles Chapter of the National Charity League which sponsors a reading center in the building it



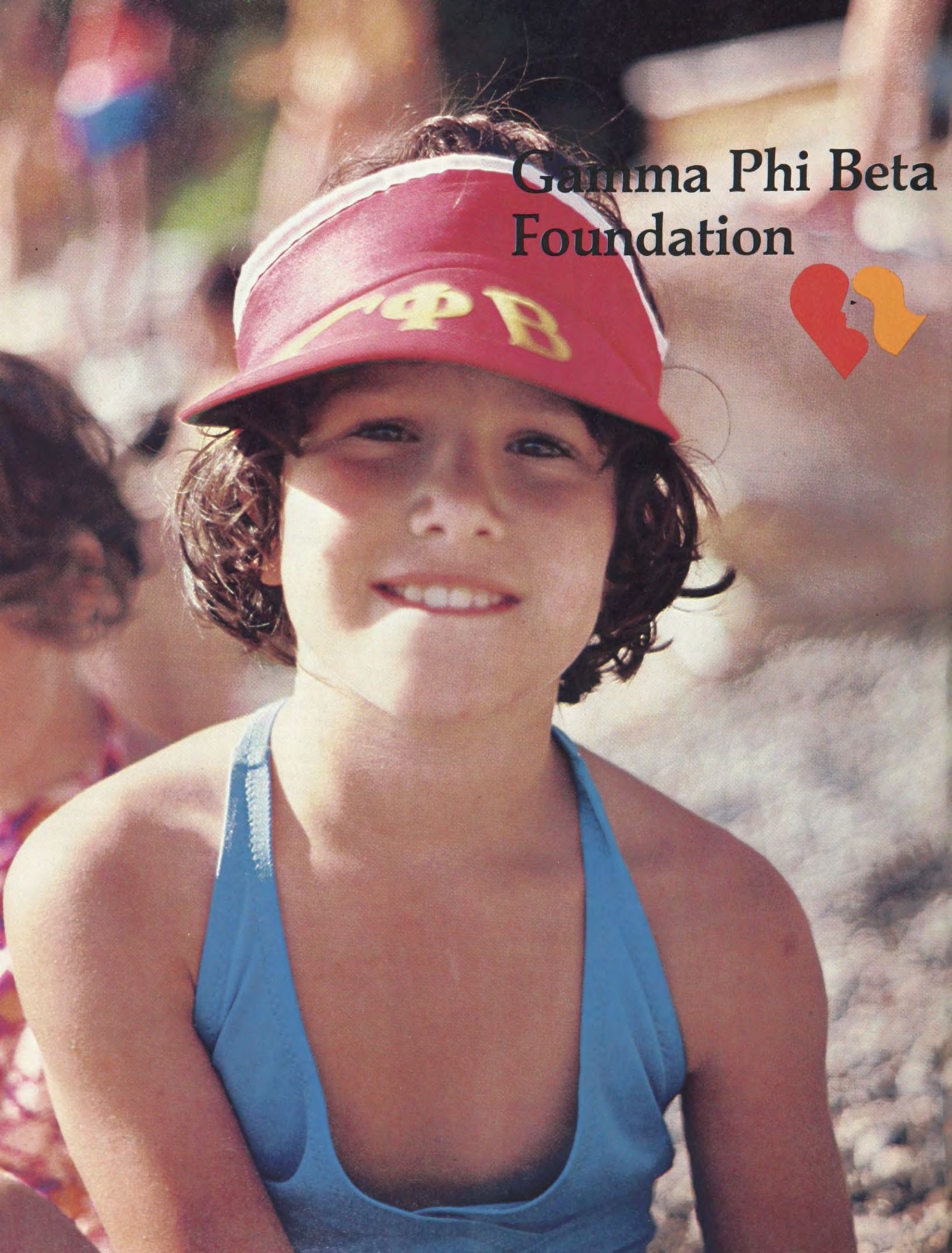

owns on Hollywood Boulevard, the Ticktock Thrift Shop in its own store in Culver City, the Coronet Ball and numerous ancillary groups that foster the mother/daughter relationship in social, cultural and philanthropic events.

Probably because of her love of travel, Mrs. Lawrence took over the chairmanship for the International Debutante Ball in Versailles. Later she was national chairman for international balls in Rome, Vienna, Venice and London. She is proud of being a member of the Pan American Clipper Club and was a passenger on Pan Am's first invitational flight in 1947. She is also proud of the plaque on her office wall proclaiming her membership in the Million Mile by Air Club.

There are more plaques on her wall: commendations from the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors for her efforts in founding the Flower Guild, a thank you from Footlighters and another from the City of Los Angeles for her work as a city commissioner during World War II. She even has an official document proclaiming her an "Admiral in the Great Navy of Nebraska."

They also have extensive experience with arranging educational based travel programs for schools and colleges.

When her marriage necessitated a move north, she began a performing arts department at Fremont, Cal. Union High School. Dottie has advanced degrees in literature and guidance and counseling.

The Bradshaws have two daughters and operate their own travel business, World In Focus. They have visited 48 countries since 1964. Jim is a professor of education at Stanford.

They did it! And what a super success it is!

The Denver Alumnae Chapter more than doubled its membership in two years and dues paying members in the North Orange County, Cal. Alumnae Chapter nearly tripled in three years. Denver is up from 118 to 259 and North Orange County from 36 to 99.

Increased membership means continuing success for these chapters through a variety of auxiliary interest groups, more successful fundraisers and more support for collegiate chapters. And, communication and meeting the needs of prospective members are the most important factors in their continuing successful membership campaigns.

Denver alumnae provide rides for sisters attending their first meeting and then greet them with pink carnations. They also receive a booklet of information about interest groups, special events and meeting dates. A follow-up contact is made after the meeting.

Area divisions provide closer contact for Denver alumnae. Neighborhood coffees enable more members to get involved on at least a part-time basis and get acquainted with nearby Gamma Phi Betas. Drivers and rides are arranged within the 26 divisions, which also provide an opportunity for more contact for information and interest groups. Through Care and Share, visits and rides for ill, hospitalized or elderly sisters, and contact with Theta Chapter collegians at Denver University are arranged.

Denver alumnae are now publishing a newsletter 10 times each year instead

of once or twice. Dues paying members are listed alphabetically in the front of the chapter directory with all others in the back by initiation chapter and year.

The Art Mart continues to be a successful fundraiser. Two new projects are auctions for art and white elephants, with part of the proceeds going to camping.

The Denver arts and crafts group made needlepoint jewelry boxes which were presented to Theta Chapter seniors at the senior party. Fifty layettes and 175 articles of children's clothing were made by the needlework guild group last year. The chapter attracts working women by having a night group. Weekend functions are an opportunity for all members to get together.

Updating the membership files and mailing list was the first step for North Orange County alumnae as they see membership recruitment to be their best fundraiser. They have found a late summer newsletter and dues notice to be the most successful in encouraging alumnae to pay international and local dues through the chapter rather than Gamma Phi Beta Central Office.

To further increase their success, newsletters and dues notices were sent to the 100 alumnae who had paid dues any of the past three years and to Delta Delta Chapter (which it sponsors) alumnae. Those living in the area were asked to pay \$20 and others were given the option of paying \$5. Nearly all paid the greater amount due in part to the alumnae chapter's affirmation of

support for the California State-Fullerton chapter.

Chapter newsletters and directories, which are sent to dues paying members only, are published in a new, cost effective format. Dues notices are computer produced.

Future plans for North Orange County alumnae include establishing a telephone committee and researching the needs and desires of members for programs and activities. They also plan a mailing to all area and Delta Delta alumnae using purchased, addressed labels. Members will be listed in an annual directory distributed in November.

Dorothy Folgner Foster (USC), former president of the alumnae chapter, suggests that all chapters designate one member to keep chapter membership files. She also encourages alumnae advisors and alumnae to educate collegians about the benefits of lifetime commitment to Gamma Phi Beta. An initiation ceremony for seniors welcomes them to alumnae status.

Another North Orange County idea is to have an alumna from each Delta Delta class responsible for keeping in touch and planning reunions. The chapter house address will be used as a permanent one for the alumnae chapter, with any changes being directed to the collegiate/alumnae relations chairman.

1881 beginnings of Beta Chapter bring $\Gamma\Phi B$ from 'society' to 'sorority'

When Alpha Chapter was eight years old, many of the 59 collegiate and alumnae members were thinking it was time to establish a second chapter. As no one seemed to be doing anything about it, Kate Gardner, a freshman, decided to make some inquiries herself.

Without notice to the rest of the chapter, she wrote a friend at the University of Michigan asking if there were an opening for a "Girl's Society." At the time, a young man from Syracuse wrote an Ann Arbor friend asking the same question. Kate's friend replied that although she had just joined such an organization (Kappa Alpha Theta, established there in 1879, and the only women's fraternity on campus), there was ample opportunity for another, and she enclosed the names of six girls. By strange coincidence, it was the same list sent to the Syracuse man by his correspondent.

Kate succeeded in arousing so much interest at Syracuse by her unorthodox proceeding that correspondence was begun with all the girls on the list. They were later interviewed by Kate and Ella French, an Alpha alumna, who had the option to initiate them if it seemed in the best interest of the society. The decision was favorable, and on June 7, 1882, Beta Chapter was installed in the rooms of Isadore Thompson and Delia Rood at 33 S. Fifth Avenue, Ann Arbor.

The six charter members of Beta Chapter were Elizabeth Cornell Stibbings, Jane Emerson Miller, Mary Hamilton Grosvenor, Delia Rood Dott, Isadore Thompson Scott and Jessica Thompson Washburn. The de-

scriptive phrases about these women were furnished by Jessica Thompson:

"Isadore Thompson, presiding with uncommon activity and decision of mind, wanted nothing to make her a perfect manager than always to think right, for no one can say but she always acted as she thought.

"Jane Emerson, 22 years, tall and straight of form, happy in sarcasm, with nettle enough for two, she possessed that invaluable coat of mail in argument . . . persistency.

"Delia Rood, 19, not petite nor yet too voluminous, as radiant as a sunflower, handsome and attracting much admiration.

"Elizabeth Cornell, small, brisk, fastidiously dressed, a person out of the common run, and possessed with an enthusiasm for dramatics.

"Minnie Hamilton, her characteristic qualities may be embodied in the three S's . . . Silence, Simplicity, and Sunshine."

After Ella French and Kate Gardner returned to Syracuse and the story of the new chapter at Michigan was published in the Syracuse newspaper, Professor Frank Smalley made his famous remark: "I presume that you young women are now members of a *sorority*," thereby coining a new word. He was a brother of Honta Smalley Bredin who would later become a member of Beta Chapter.

The dominant note of Gamma Phi

Beta, according to Ada Gilbert Close, was the insistence on a high standard of excellence in academic work. This was not spoken of often but was always in the background. Some times members did not rush someone they liked, because "her University work was not up to our mark." While they did take Gamma Phi Beta quite seriously, they were "gay, went out a great deal, and were perhaps rather vain of the fact that they were popular."

That a number of Gamma Phi Beta songs originated in Ann Arbor is another story. Beta members were

"Amicae" was written by Helen Fallows Williams, daughter of Bishop Fallows of Chicago. A great favorite, written in June, 1886, the girls often sang it after dinner. "We Are Gamma Phis Forever" by Isabella Andrews Talley was always sung at chapter banquets. The tune is an old German folk song. Ruth Guppy, one of Beta's first pledges, wrote "Our Meeting Night" in 1884 to the tune of an old college song, "Seeing Nellie Home." This was sung at picnics and informal get togethers.

During the early years of this century Beta was proud of its alumnae who studied abroad toward doctorate degrees. Others distinguished themselves by handling nursing assignments all over the country, chairing the department of political economy at Mt. Holyoke College, and being dean of women and associate professor of English literature at the University of Illinois.

The June, 1900 issue of THE CRESCENT tells how far fraternity and sorority life had advanced at the Uni-

versity of Michigan. When the Kappa Alpha Theta chapter was founded there, there were eight women on campus—and this was nine years after women had been admitted to the university in 1870. Twenty years later sororities had become very much a part of university life. About one-fourth of the students were members of fraternities and sororities, but this was 1,000 students belonging in all 33 groups. Of these, 10 were sororities, of which one was medical and one musical. Greeks had become a dominant force on campus.

Coeducational institutions were still, in 1900, a new enough phenomenon that they were much discussed by the general public, and Michigan, as the largest of these, was not exempt from criticism. The Beta correspondent defended the relationship between men and women on campus: "All women on campus were treated with respect and courtesy. There were many opportunities for pleasant amusement and activities between men and women. However, it was true that the girls occasionally attended concerts and football games without masculine protection, enjoying the company of other women." It was pointed out that "this is a college that fosters independence in all."

The first Beta Chapter house was rented on South State Street at the corner of Hill, and served the girls for 12 years. Some of the fathers paid for the coal in June so the chapter could take advantage of the bonus offered for early purchase.

In 1906 the chapter and their alumnae bought a house on Oakland Avenue at East University. In a few years that house proved inadequate and building plans were drawn. In 1911, the lot at 1520 S. University was purchased and by 1913 the house was completed. It was to be enlarged in the mid-1950s because Gamma Phi Beta had grown so much.

Beta Chapter is proud of Lillian Thompson, delegate to the organizational meeting of National Panhellenic Conference held in Chicago in 1902. As Gamma Phi Beta's delegate for 34 years, she worked untiringly to encourage harmony among sororities.

Another first for Michigan Gamma Phi Betas that has resulted in a permanent addition to that campus is the Michigan League. The chapter often

supplied League officers and Gamma Phi Beta was the first group to realize the necessity for a Women's League building. They started the campaign that resulted in the construction of the beautiful building that opened in 1929.

From former Grand President Elizabeth Wheeler Olsen come memories of the early depression years: "Heels and hose, hats and gloves were required campus wear. The house closed at 10 p.m. sharp. No one less than the house president greeted members at the door if we were even two minutes late." Her other memories include throwing snowballs in the Arb in May after a freak snowstorm and the time the house caught fire during initiation when all were herded out onto the front lawn in their 'angel robes.'

One of the favorite parties during the early 1930s was the Memorial Day Breakfast Dance—a breakfast with several courses at one of the country clubs with dancing between courses and afterward.

There were live orchestras for every party, for many men students during the depression were earning their way through college playing in dance bands. Every Friday and Saturday, September through June, there were at least eight or 10 dances scheduled. In addition, there was informal dancing at the League Ballroom on Sunday afternoons. Beta's Shirl Crosman Larson, later Shirl Conway of Broadway and television, was a popular singer at the League.

Rush teas were very elegant with lots of silver and candles. Toasted mushroom sandwiches were made by the maids of some of the alumnae, but each member was allowed only two during the tea. At the last formal rush party a small dance orchestra provided music while rushees and members danced together.

Although the enrollment at Michigan did not show a sharp decrease during World War II, conditions on campus were obviously changed—the most noticeable being a dramatic increase in enrollment in scientific courses. There was a new informality between professors and students, especially during the summer. School was held all year round in 1943, starting in October with just a week's vacation at Christmas. Those who came from a distance never went home, since there was no room on trains because serv-

icemen were traveling.

When a Gamma Phi Beta became engaged, her fiance was to give the chapter 15 pounds of candy (up from five pounds in 1936). Due to the shortage of sugar and candy, this had to be given in installments using different people's ration books.

At the 1958 Convention the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation was established and Beta's Delphine Johnson Andrews was named its first President. Among the other five members of the governing board were two Beta members, Grand President Elizabeth Wheeler Olsen and future Grand President Orra Spencer Reid.

During the early 1960s forces were at work on the west coast and in the midwest that would attempt to undermine the entire Greek system. Although things were running smoothly and membership continued to grow, charges of discrimination were leveled at sororities and fraternities.

At the University of Michigan the turmoil and unrest were severe, and the number of students going through rush decreased dramatically and remained small throughout the 1970s.



The numbers of new initiates of Beta Chapter fell from 20 in 1970 to zero in 1971. The house was financially strong, however, and Jeanne Mulder Hribal, recalls that it provided "a quiet place that did not reflect all the craziness of the campus. We had curfews at the house and I remember hurrying back for midnight and one o'clock deadlines on weekends."

Since there had been no one initiated since December, 1970, the summer of 1972 was a dismal time. There would be five chapter members returning in the fall. No one wanted to see the house close, so it was decided to take in boarders. The five Gamma Phi Betas rushed all year long, sometimes to the detriment of their studies. In the

spring they were joined by nine initiates, and it is to these women that the chapter owes its existence today. Little by little, as the decade progressed, the chapter grew stronger and larger. Each year there were fewer boarders, until in 1982 there were none.

Beta Chapter of Gamma Phi Beta has initiated nearly 1,500 women. Through the growth of the total woman, each has gained qualities that have enriched her life.

Iowan 'pledged' since infancy; legacy spans 65 years

Louise Hoover Shellady started a family tradition in 1919 when she pledged Rho Chapter at the University of Iowa. Her daughter Jacqueline Shellady Benson became an Iowa Gamma Phi Beta in 1945, and granddaughter Julie Benson Hayek was initiated in 1971.

Jacqueline's pledgship at Rho Chapter actually began as an infant. On many occasions Mrs. Shellady was at the Gamma Phi Beta house in the absence of the housemother, and often took Jacqueline along. The girls fell in love with the baby and pinned a pledge pin to her dress on one visit. She didn't have it for long because there was a shortage of pins for the new pledge class. Several years later Jacqueline had a pledge pin of her own. "I am the first to have three generations of Gamma Phi Betas in Rho Chapter," said Mrs. Shellady, now 83 years old.

She lives at Oaknoll Retirement Residence in Iowa City and has seen a great amount of change on campus over the years. Mrs. Shellady remembers a time when there were only 2,500 students. Today there are 30,000. "Of course I didn't know everyone's name," she said, "but we

were all speaking acquaintances." In 1918, the average class had about 60 students, but never more than 100. Today some classes have 300.

Combing through a pile of college momentos and newspaper clippings, she withdrew a military pass aged yellow with time and bandaged with tape. "I'm probably the only one in Iowa City who still has one of these," she said. Students had to show the passes to military police in order to enter their classrooms. "The government actually took over campus," Mrs. Shellady said. Because of the American involvement in World War I, a Student Army Training Corp was established at Iowa for the purpose of drilling and preparing undrafted young men for potential military service.

Yet amid the serious nature of world politics the campus was not without fun moments. Mrs. Shellady recalls "dancing with the fellas" at university dances in Schaeffer Hall. "We had some good bands back then," she said, while admitting that she attended the dances "quite a bit." In many cases it was the only opportunity for socializing.

Her favorite evenings were spent at the Delta Chi house where the fraternity members invited dates to Sunday dinner and dancing. Cloyde Shellady,

the Delta Chi who stole her heart while the two attended Iowa City High School, gave her his fraternity pin when she was a junior in high school.

"I went to high school in the mornings and to the university in the afternoons," she said. She needed only two credits to graduate and decided to enroll in university French and English courses.

An Iowa Hawkeye sports fan since age two (her parents drove horse and buggy to games at the turn of the century and never managed to find a babysitter), she still goes to football games. For 13 years she has attended the games with a friend who has special access to tickets because her husband was on the athletic staff. "I drive, pay the parking fee and buy the program," said Mrs. Shellady. As for Hawkeye basketball, "I watch the games on television." She gave up her basketball ticket several years ago because she didn't like to drive in the dark.

Mrs. Shellady participates in the community and her church, and continues to be actively involved as an alumna of Gamma Phi Beta. In description of her involvement with the university and Rho Chapter she said, "I've been very loyal."

People power key to chapter's enrichment

Let's face it. The days of "the-same-old-thing" are behind us as both collegiate and alumnae chapters strive to implement Personal And Chapter Enrichment programs on a regular basis.

By surveying the membership and exploring resources both within the chapter and within the community, each chapter can both identify and address the particular needs and interests of its membership. Expanding horizons and striving to meet higher and higher goals as encouraged by PACE require time, energy and dedication on the part of both the chapter leaders and the members.

Why is it that some chapters just seem to accomplish more, and more effectively focus on the various aspects of PACE? Is it simply because they have more money? . . . more members? Not necessarily! The quantity of their resources is not the key factor. The key lies in the use of those resources.

Surely the most valuable resource we have in Gamma Phi Beta is people-power, and people-power can best be activated by leaders who know how to delegate effectively. Effective delegation spreads responsibilities so that no *one* person is overburdened, creates an atmosphere of mutual achievement and encourages greater participation among group members.

Whether the leader be the chapter president or a committee chairman, she can combine time management methods, communication skills and motivation techniques to more effectively delegate tasks. A skilled delegator will positively influence the self-confidence of individual group

members as well as the overall group image. These five steps offer valuable guidelines.

Develop a positive attitude toward delegating.

One of the major barriers to delegating is the I-have-to-do-it-all-myself attitude. The longer the leader maintains this attitude, the less open the members will be to delegated tasks. By demonstrating a willingness to "let go" as well as the ability to guide and assist members who are taking on new tasks, the leader can create an atmosphere that will be conducive to real commitment and mutual success. A positive attitude toward the concept of delegating indicates faith in, and respect for the chapter and its members. This will, in turn, positively affect members' self-confidence, which is vital to their willingness to earnestly participate.

Listen before delegating.

Whether it be through a formal survey or through personal contact, listening is essential. Sounds easy? Not really. Listening is a skill that requires energy, commitment and practice. The leader who is a good listener will become aware of members' interests, abilities, attitudes and feelings so that the right person can be approached with the right job. Once again, being listened to will enhance a person's self-confidence and increase her openness to accepting responsibilities.

Establish achievable goals, understandable procedures and gain agreement.

Failure to work with the members and establish clear goals and steps toward those goals can easily end in reverse delegation—more work for the leader. Defining goals tends to alleviate the risk faced by people who are tackling a new task for the first time.

Once again, when a member knows she will have appropriate guidelines as well as room for experimentation and finding her own most effective approach to a task, her sense of self-confidence will be strengthened.

Make necessary information, materials and support accessible.

Here's where a well prepared budget and a notebook indicating what has been done in the past are vital. Even if the hows and whys of a delegated task are clear, the task may be done poorly or avoided totally if information, materials and support (both people and money) are not available when needed. Even the most motivated member can be frustrated and annoyed when trying to complete a task without the necessary support. Such an experience can easily discourage future participation.

Offer regular follow-up, reinforcement and recognition.

Good performance that is not noticed most likely will deteriorate. Be sure that those who are putting forth special effort on behalf of the chapter are recognized. Pink carnations at meetings, a note in the newsletter, a personal call, recognition at Founders Day or another major chapter function are essential. A leader who is willing to give credit for work well done creates an attitude of long term commitment among her chapter members rather than one of short term tolerance.

By delegating more tasks more effectively, a chapter leader increases her personal impact and positively influences the productivity, unity and level of participation among the members of the chapter. A chapter can truly keep up the PACE when commitment is strong, goals clear and tasks distributed.

Meeting the special needs of patients Reverend usually the first one there

Rev. June Michaelson Taylor (Goucher) is director of pastoral services for Presbyterian University Hospital in Pittsburgh.

Unlike some top industry administrators, she has a great deal of contact with people, most of which involves helping patients deal with grief and the crises that accompany major illnesses and injuries. She also acts as a liaison for patients.

"If there is an immediate crisis, I'm usually the first one there," June said. "Then I notify their respective rabbis, priests or ministers."

Staff education to facilitate a better understanding of patients' special needs is another of her responsibilities. She also ministers to staff members and patients' families, and supervises 45 volunteers and students, including 25 night pastors. June is field education supervisor for Pittsburgh Seminary.

Sister computes risk, buys own company

Two years ago Kathie Hughes (Penn St.) traded the relatively secure life of an assistant vice president of a large financial corporation for the risks that are part of owning

her own business.

What motivated her to take this chance in switching from employee to employer?

While employed in Los Angeles, Kathie investigated the possible acquisition of Specialized Computer Services, a Portland, Ore. business. When her employer opted not to proceed with the recommended purchase, she realized this was an opportunity to take on a new challenge and become her own boss. "I was tired of being subordinate to several layers of management and decided it had to be an improvement to be my own boss even with the increased responsibility," she said. She understood the nature of the business and her research had proved it to be a viable company providing needed computer services in the Pacific Northwest.

In the two years that Kathie has been president of the company, it has changed from a service bureau providing remote computer processing to petroleum and sanitary service companies to a full service data processing company. She and

15 employees provide the latest in microcomputer hardware and specialized software, including packages for word processing and financial spread-sheet calculations to businesses in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California. Even a few games have been created for small businesses in general.

"The computer market is changing more drastically now than at any time since I first started to work in 1961," Kathie said. She foresees that during the next five years most businesses will acquire their own computers, eliminating the need for outside computer time. Companies like hers will be selling computer hardware and software packages as well as providing software customization, training, maintenance and backup. Her own plans include expanding her market area.

Kathie realizes that the intense pressures of her competitive business necessitate relaxation and she makes time to play tennis at least three times each week. She also refreshes herself with non-business travel when her schedule permits.

Camp fosters independence for hemophiliac children

Ruth Seeler, M.D. (Vermont) takes camping to heart in a special way. She is director of Camp Warren Jyrch, Antioch, Ill., where 25 boys enjoy a two week taste of independence and community living.

The boys and the counselors have hemophilia, a bleeding disorder affecting one male in 10,000. According to Ruth, president of the Hemophiliac Foundation of Illinois and chairman of the Pediatric Hematology and Oncology Division of Cook County Hospital, the biggest

misconception about the disease is that people bleed to death from simple scrapes and scratches. Not so. The bleeding, caused by a missing clotting factor in the blood, is usually internal and often into muscles and joints. Hemophiliacs are often afflicted with severe arthritis because of the bleeding.

During the camp session, the boys will use more than 100 infusions of concentrated coagulation factors (from plasma) administered in the doctors' cabin, at a picnic ta-

ble or when necessary by lantern and flashlight.

The Hemophiliac Foundation underwrites the program which costs about \$325 for each camper. The maximum fee charged to families is \$165 and campsships are available.

In her quest for independence for hemophiliacs, Ruth encourages self-infusion, what she calls "target practice." Children as young as eight or nine years old start to learn to mix their own plasma concentrate which gives them the missing clotting factor. The "target" in these practice sessions is not on the archery range but on the doctors.

The camp provides the first step toward independence. It's the reason Ruth spends her vacation every summer working 24 hours a day.

She says the camp is run just like a normal boys' camp, "but with no good fights." A full range of physical activities includes canoeing, fishing, swimming, tennis, archery, softball, arts and crafts and camping trips.

More important is camaraderie among campers and developing an awareness of how to live a more normal life. This is a process that Ruth terms "an emotional disaster" at first. "In the real world, when push comes to shove, any child with a handicap always falls back on it as a failsafe, his last defense. Up here it just doesn't hold. You can't say, 'I can't swim to the raft because I'm a hemophilia' because other hemophiliacs are doing just that. You have to say, 'I have to learn to swim better.'"

Quarter century in the laboratory lands tech Who's Who distinction

Twenty-five years of professional activity as a pathology laboratory technologist and director in hospitals and private laboratories has re-

warded Merry Ann Ottosen Leftwich (Goucher) with inclusion in the 1983-84 edition of Who's Who of American Women.

Merry Ann is the author of several books on laboratory work, and magazine articles relating to lab techniques. She has written biographical features about the founders of pathology, and several monographs designed to interest young people in the laboratory field. Merry Ann is technical services director at a pathology lab in La Jolla, Cal.

Her career includes the creation and development of a reference and research library of tissue blocks containing in excess of 100,000 specimens. She has prepared and provided scores of study sets for students seeking their doctorates in pathology. Many of her designs and charts illustrating and simplifying laboratory procedures are displayed on the walls of the lab where she works.

Merry Ann also collects antique branding irons and is a avid gardener. She has two sons and three grandchildren.

"We had our children in an era when young mothers didn't work at outside jobs unless they had to," said Peg Ihling Nelson (Michigan), so she started doing some volunteer work one day a week. "As our children grew up and left home, I just became more involved in community things."

Peg recently threw her 30th garden party for older adults from Neighborhood House in Milwaukee. It is a United Way agency which offers programs from nursery schools to Parents Anonymous, to after-school groups and elder citizen activities for inner city residents.

In 1953, Peg held her first garden party. "With a new baby, I knew I would not be able to continue with the older adult summer outings and picnics in parks, as I had been doing," she said. Having been around the oldsters enough to know they loved gardens, she hit upon the idea

As the parties grew, Neighborhood House rented tables and chairs, but all food preparation is still up to Peg who hasn't repeated a menu in all those years. Friends and neighbors help with the serving, and neighbors' freezers take some of the food that can be prepared ahead of time.

For the last luncheon (Peg hopes someone else will take over now) about 50 guests were bused to the Nelson home in mid-morning. After inspecting the gardens, Peg and friends served them lunch.

Peg is now vice president of Neighborhood House, where she has remained involved in all its pro-

grams through the years. She and her husband Ken are known around town for their founding of the 59 and Holding group 12 years ago. Through their church they organize dinner parties with a program eight or nine times a year for 50 older adults.

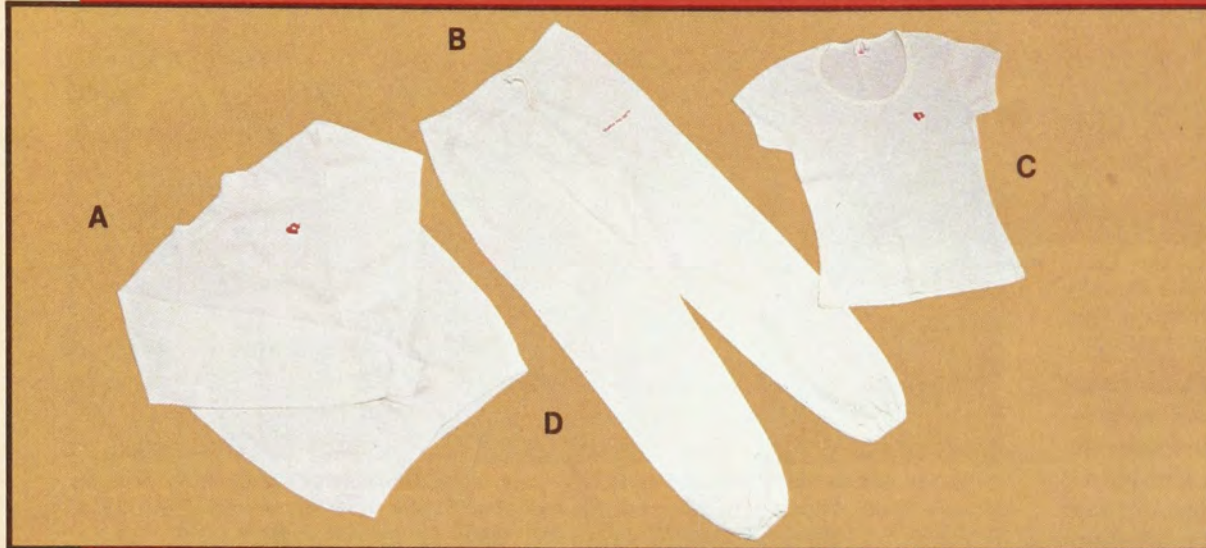

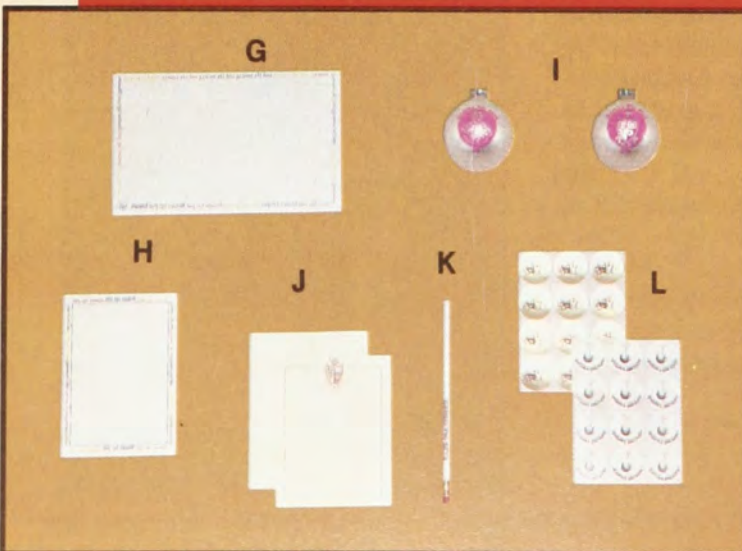
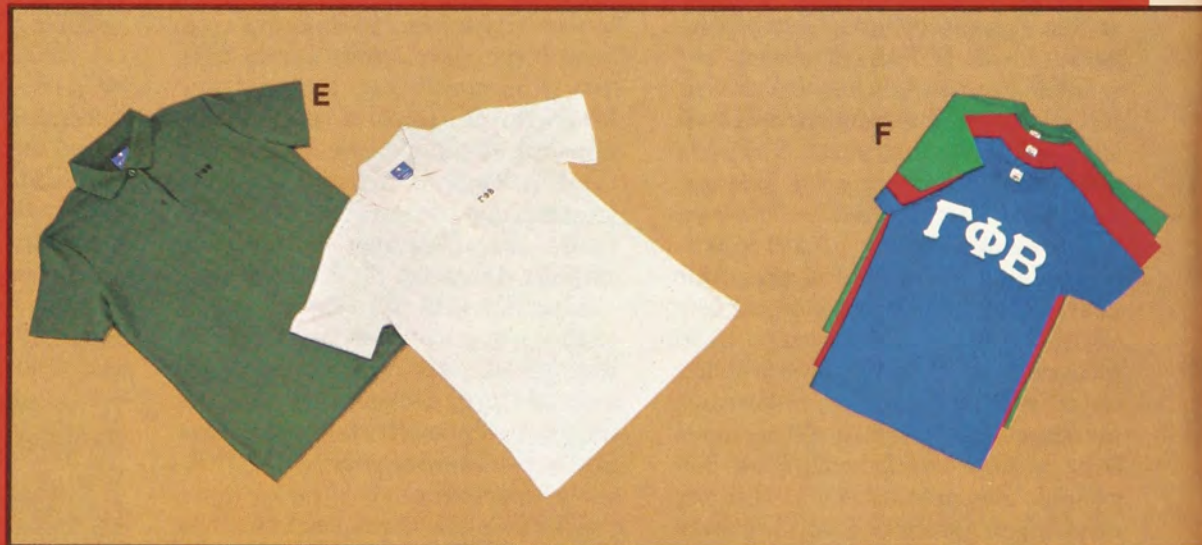
