Olympic Excellence

he coach of the dazzling synchronized swimming team that won the first gold medals in that new Olympic event was Gamma Phi Beta Charlotte Jennings Davis (Washington). Tracie Ruiz and Candy Costle, both from Seattle, were Charlotte's attentive students and gold medalists.

Charlotte became so consumed with the athletes' Olympic preparation she quit her job at the Seattle Aquatic Club to concentrate on their training. For the past three years she has accompanied them to Japan, Venezuela, Russia, Germany, Switzerland, Italy and Canada. Her two charges have not lost a competition in the last two years, and at the recent Rome Open were awarded a first-ever perfect score in international competition. As one Seattle sportswriter put it, "Davis must be an exceptionally good coach."

Charlotte began working with the two women eight years ago. "I'll never forget the first time I knew what their potential was," she said. "They were 13 years old (both are now 21) and I remember sitting the two of them down and telling them they had what it took to become national champions one day." She told them if they listened and stuck with it, they could do it.

Training days included running, weight lifting, aerobics, endurance swimming, dance classes and recording sessions to master the music. Then they went back in the water for a couple of more hours. Wake

up calls were frequently for 3:30 am. "Basically, every day we worked on this for seven hours, five in the water and two on the other activities."

Charlotte herself was on a national championship synchronized swim team, the Santa Clara Aquamaids, and was an All American synchronized swimmer. The inclusion of the sport as an Olympic event came too late for Charlotte to participate as an athlete, so she did it as a coach. Her coaching will continue as she has been named the first United States professional synchronized swimming coach.

In duet synchronized swimming the competitors must be perfectly coordinated with each other and with the music. As in some other sports, there are compulsory figures and some improvisations. They spend as much as 50 seconds under water. Tracie Ruiz, who won an individual gold medal, had 13 different musical tempos to adjust to in her individual routine.

Charlotte is from a Gamma Phi Beta family. Her mother is Patricia Stickler Jennings (Washington), former Area Financial Advisor. Her two sisters, Janet Jennings Getzendaner and Susan Jennings Wylie, are also University of Washington Gamma Phi Betas.

Charlotte has two young sons and a supportive and understanding husband, Glen.

The Seattle Alumnae Chapter has established a scholarship for collegiate members of Lambda Chapter which honors a different distinguished alumna each year. The first scholarship was named for Lois McBride Dehn (Washington), former Gamma Phi Beta Grand President.

Carrie K. York, a University of Washington junior, received the first scholarship. She has a 3.6 grade average and is a zoology major emphasizing math and science. Carrie volunteers at the University of Washington Dental Clinics and plans to attend dental school. She is chapter scholarship chairman and served as delegate to the Area Leadership Conference and as pledge class vice president. An honors graduate from Mercer Island, Wash. High School, Carrie received the Robert Studebaker Award for scholarship, leadership and service.

The Lambda House Corporation Board conceived the idea and was assisted by Area Financial Advisor Louisa Brown Pierson (Washington). Administered by the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation, the scholarship is awarded annually to a collegiate member of Lambda Chapter.

Each year the scholarship will honor a different alumna, living or deceased, who will be selected by a committee of Seattle alumnae. Lois McBride Dehn exemplifies the ideals outlined by the committee: a loyal member who has demonstrated at the local and/or international level a true love of the ideals and purposes of the Sorority. Contributions to the collegiate chapter, alumnae chapter, house corporation board and/or international Gamma Phi Beta are considered.

Mrs. Dehn was president of Lambda Chapter and graduated magna cum laude in 1916. She served as Seattle Alumnae Chapter president, International Scholarship Chairman and was Grand President from 1936 to 1940. Mrs. Dehn was instrumental in raising funds to help build the present chapter

house and served as a house corporation board member for 50 years.

The final selection of the scholarship recipient is the responsibility of the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation. A preliminary selection is made by a local review committee which includes the alumnae chapter president or her appointee, alumna advisor, financial advisor, collegiate chapter president and scholarship chairman, and four members at large.

Applicants must be Lambda Chapter initiated members or affiliates in good standing. They are considered on the basis of scholastic achievement, contribution to Lambda Chapter and financial need.

In 1982, Louisa Pierson developed a successful fund raising plan. After contacting alumnae, the scholarship was partially endowed and at Founders Day 1982, a competition "between decades" encouraged members to donate to the fund. In May, 1983, donations received at Lambda's 80th birthday party brought the fund to the required endowment amount of \$10,000. The interest earned from the principal is used for the scholarship.— Sally Ford Brown (Washington)

Scholarship for special alumnae honors Doris Bird Gorden

A scholarship for special alumnae has been established by Bill and Doris Bird Gorden (Bowling Green). Named by her husband, it is the Doris B. Gorden Scholarship for Special Alumnae.

Scholarship applicants must be alumnae in good standing. Other factors for consideration are physical handicap; illness or disability of the alumna, the child or husband; or divorce or widowhood. Financial need and other special considerations are additional criteria.

In 1954, Doris was confined to an iron lung as the result of polio. There were two young children at home and another was born three and one-half months into Doris' eight month hospitalization.

"Our friends rallied and help came from areas that sometimes seemed least likely," Bill said. "We never lost faith and within a few short years Doris was again able to take over the family management without help."

Doris returned to school after her bout with polio, taking night courses at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. Then in 1965, she broke her leg and kneecap getting off an airplane and spent 78 days in traction in the hospital and another year in braces. Her fourth child was born two months after the fall.

"Through experience we know that life can change suddenly and create serious challenges," Doris said. "We have appreciated all the help that has been offered to us through the years, especially the friendship and support of our Gamma Phi Beta friends. The Cincinnati alumnae were so kind and caring, transporting me to meetings in spite of all the braces and wheelchair."

The Gordens established the scholarship "to help Gamma Phi Betas who may find themselves in similar circumstances, in need of funds to return to school for refresher courses or a career

change," said Bill. "It is impossible for us to ever repay our friends for their help over the years when we needed it except through our efforts to help others."

Doris earned a pilot's license while at Bowling Green and was a DC3 stewardess. She is a member of United Airlines Clipped Wings (retired flight attendants), which raises funds for the mentally retarded. A volunteer at Bryn Mawr Rehabilitation Hospital with nearly 1,000 hours, Doris is a board member and chairman of volunteers. Time permitting, she enjoys needlework and rug hooking.

Doris served the Cincinnati Alumnae Chapter as magazine chairman in the 1950s. She has been a member of the Philadelphia West Suburban Alumnae Chapter since 1960, and has been president, vice president, area recommendations chairman and magazine chairman. Appointed Assistant to the Alumnae Vice President-Bylaws in 1983, Doris gave a bylaws workshop at the 1984 Convention. She was delegate to the 1976, 1980 and 1982 Conventions and a visitor in 1974.

Bill flew "Hellcat" off a Navy cruiser in the Pacific during World War II. A graduate of Wayne State University in Detroit, he was employed by Sun Company for 35 years until retirement in 1983. Bill is now president of Gorden, Inc., a business consulting firm. Doris is secretary-treasurer.

An avid golfer, Bill also fishes and gardens. He is chairman of the annual Country Fair for Bryn Mawr Rehabilitation Hospital.

The Gordens' four children are David, a Lt. Commander in the Navy Seabees; Janet, a realtor; Michael, owner of Journey Electronics Corp.; and Robert, a student and musician. They are grandparents to two boys and three girls, the youngest of whom was born as Doris flew home from the 1984 Convention.

Gamma celebrates 100 years at the University of Wisconsin

an't you just see it?
The setting was the dining room in Ladies
Hall on the University of Wisconsin campus. It was
dinner time on November 15, 1885. The small group
of coeds (there were only about 100 women students
at the time) were chatting happily when it happened.


Six attractive young women wearing radiant smiles and shining crescent badges entered the room single file and sat down at one of the large tables. The other young women in the dining room nearly died on the spot, including 16 members of Kappa Kappa Gamma and 20 members of Delta Gamma. An eyewitness reported that one sorority member "was so upset that she put her bread under her plate, excused herself, and rushed off to her room."

The six proud new Gamma Phi Betas were Carrie E. Morgan, Mary Clark, Leora Chase, Zerlena and Mary Knox, and Cora Bennett. Flora Waldo, sister of two Badger football stars, later became the first initiate, after which four "outstanding freshmen" were pledged. The initiation ceremony for the original six was conducted in total secrecy by Grace Darling and Elizabeth Cornell, friends of Carrie Morgan and members of Beta Chapter at the University of Michigan.

Two years after its installation, Gamma Chapter had grown and quarters of its own were desired. Then came a period during which the members lived in a procession of dreary, totally unpretentious boarding houses.

In 1904, Mary Clark Brittingham, one of the charter members, decided it was high time that Gamma Chapter had a house of its own. Mrs. Brittingham organized a fund drive with stock selling at \$25 per share, with guaranteed five percent interest. The stock was promptly purchased and it was a happy day May 1, 1905, when ground was broken at 428 Sterling Court for a three story clapboard and stucco house in light and dark brown. The house was ready for fall rush and was completely filled with ecstatic Gamma Phi Betas.

In 1927, the Gamma Phi Beta house had been outgrown and was beginning to show extreme wear and tear. Remodeling was considered impractical. Once again Mrs. Brittingham and other alumnae put on their "fighting clothes" and launched an elaborate fund drive for an "elegant" home for Gamma Chapter. Again everyone rallied and two lots were purchased at 270 Langdon Street. Architect Frank Riley designed the stunning, spacious Italian style brick house which is still the chapter home.

It has been truthfully stated that Gamma Chapter has always enjoyed great prestige and respect on campus and it is equally true that the chapter has always produced young women to carry on high standards of leadership. However, credit for the chapter's 100 outstanding years should be given principally to Mary Clark Brittingham and Florence Stott Sullivan.

Both were wealthy and had tremendous business acumen. Both were forceful and insisted on the highest standards for Gamma Chapter. Both were willing to work endlessly and tirelessly for their Sorority. When Mrs. Brittingham died in 1929, Mrs. Sullivan was competent and qualified to take over the role of leader and "matriarch." When Mrs. Sullivan died in 1983, just two months short of her 101st birthday, she had devoted more than 70 years of loyal service to Gamma Phi Beta.

Now hundreds of Gamma Chapter alumnae are making plans to return for the gala centennial celebration on April 26, 27 and 28, 1985, in Madison. The celebration will include dinner parties in the homes of Madison alumnae, a bus tour of campus, an open house at the newly redecorated chapter house and an elegant banquet.

The motto above the fireplace in the chapter house library says "Haec olim meminisse juabit," which means literally, "May you rejoice in these memories." Gamma alumnae and collegians intend to rejoice in April for 100 years of unforgettable, happy memories.

sisterLink is Gamma Phi Beta's exciting new career networking program designed to assist members with their career goals. It has opportunities for participation by all Sorority members.

Introduced at the 1984 Convention, SisterLink began in 1983 with a pilot program in four collegiate and alumnae chapters. It was successful in providing members with information, advice and personal contacts. Now it is available to all Gamma Phi Beta chapters.

Let's take a look at how Gamma Phi Betas in various situations can participate in SisterLink.

Sally is a college senior at the University of Missouri majoring in journalism. She has been active in Alpha Delta Chapter and will soon graduate. She would like a position with a major metropolitan newspaper. She knows it's a competitive market, but she has good grades and has been a newspaper intern in her hometown. She's worried that her resume will get lost in the shuffle and wishes she had some personal contacts for advice.

SisterLink can help Sally get those contacts through the alumnae chapter SisterLink chairman who has a file of members' careers. Sally can contact the SisterLink chairmen in the cities she chooses to learn the names and addresses of Gamma Phi Betas in her field or who have newspaper contacts.

Laura and her husband were just transferred to Chicago from Des Moines. She's been teaching school, but isn't sure she wants to continue in that field. Her husband suggests that, with her skills, she might enjoy a training position in business. She wonders if her teaching skills will be valuable, how to sell her experience and where she should begin to find that kind of position.

Laura can turn to SisterLink to answer her questions, to learn how to translate her teaching skills into an effective resume for a training position, and for contacts in the Chicago area to begin her job search. First, she should contact the alumnae chapter's SisterLink chairman, who will know members employed in the training field and be able to suggest resources Laura can use to land a position.

Barbara and her husband, both Texas natives, have lived in Dallas all of their married life. They have two married sons and are thoroughly enjoying their grand-children. She has been active in the alumnae chapter, the hospital auxiliary, committees on education and many other volunteer organizations over the years. Her husband has been a member and officer of various service organizations.

chairman. Barbara filled out an information sheet listing a number of companies and career fields in which she, her husband and sons have friends and contacts. She indicated she'd be happy to talk with other Gamma Phi Betas looking for positions in those fields.

These three situations illustrate how SisterLink operates. Other questions to be answered are: What are the goals of the SisterLink program? How is SisterLink set up? How can a member volunteer to be a SisterLink contact? How does a chapter start a SisterLink program?

The goals of SisterLink include providing members with career information, programming and contacts; bringing alumnae and collegians together through shared goals and involvement; tapping alumnae talent and resources; being an attractive benefit of membership; and addressing future needs of members in areas such as career planning, reentry to the work world and other related topics.

SisterLink is set up in three parts. First, the network of volunteers throughout the country who will answer questions, give advice, make referrals and act as resources for other members. This network will also include a computer database, which will furnish contacts by location, by occupation, or both, and is to be in operation by 1986.

The second part is made up of alumnae and collegiate SisterLink chairmen. Those women will gather member information and resource material, as well as answer inquiries from other members. The Sorority will provide information and guidance for SisterLink chairmen.

The third part of SisterLink involves International Gamma Phi Beta and administrative support from Central Office. This will include forms, printouts, the computer database and other support materials as SisterLink evolves.

Any Gamma Phi Beta can volunteer to be a SisterLink contact. A member may submit information now, or wait to respond to the request that will be made next fall to set up the database. Any collegiate or alumnae chapter can start a SisterLink program using the packet that was sent to all chapters in the fall.

Activity cookbook features seasonal treats for children

Jackie Jundt (Wash.—St. Louis) turned her natural organizational skills, innate common sense, love for young children, and mathematical and culinary ability into a wonderful activity cookbook for children aged three to eight.

She claims the book, Cooking Up Learning, was "just a happening." While studying for her masters degree she used a recipe to demonstrate math to children, and a friend, Lucy Rumpf, suggested a collaboration. "I'll do the printing and art work," Lucy said, and Jackie found herself in the book writing,

publishing and distribution business. So far, with only word of mouth promotion, the book has sold in every state, including Alaska and Hawaii, as well as several countries overseas. She is looking for a national distributor.

Cooking Up Learning is charming. It is keyed to seasonal favorites, is artistically eye-catching with hand lettering instead of the usual printing, and gives recommendations for additional reading, special projects and field trips. Recipes and activities for young children prove that "cooking is an exciting and pleasant sensory experience and provide avenues for the development of concepts in mathematics, language, science and social studies."

For fall Jackie suggests Jack O'Lantern Cookies, made with graham crackers, orange frosting and raisins for faces. Simple! And the accompanying reading list is a potpourri of Halloween hauntings that children love. Pumpkin bread is a little more complicated, but ingredients are carefully counted, illustrated and numbered as many times as necessary to show quantity by individual cupfuls or spoonfuls. As all Jackie's recipes, it can be done on a one-on-one basis or in a group.

A field trip to accompany pumpkin bread is an expedition to a pumpkin farm. Math projects using the pumpkin involve weighing and measuring it and making geometric shapes for its facial features. For science projects, try planting pumpkin seeds in a flower pot and watching them grow, or, after Halloween, let your Jack O'Lantern grow old and moldy. Examine the mold under a magnifying glass.

The other seasons are just as enticing. A winter science project coordinated with Snow Crackers is checking on a plastic bowl full of water that has been placed outside.

Look at it at intervals. After it has frozen, have children bring it inside and watch what happens and why. The saltine crackers frosted with a combination of beaten egg whites, vanilla and sugar are broiled until golden and can be eaten while children are introduced to four books about snow.

Jackie had spent 17 years in early childhood education at the time the book was written, teaching three year olds through fourth grades. She also headed the Ronald Beasley School. During her experience she found that children need to have total development, i.e. not favoring the right or left side of the brain. The book's activities are geared for that kind of full development. Cooking helps children become well organized and following a recipe requires planning ahead and working step-by-step, Jackie said. The result is a goodie to eat.

Since the book's publication, Jackie has left education to work as office manager for a law firm with 170 attorneys. "Education is too political," she said. "I would only go back to it by starting my own school that would be private for students aged three through sixth grade with no board of directors." In the meantime she is working on a new project, a book for retarded people.

Strategy for CBEST

Prospective teachers in California cower before the rigorous requirements of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST), so Elna Magnusson Dimock (Idaho) has written a concise instructional guide to help them prepare their students. Pass the CBEST is a fact filled 150 page volume with three complete practice tests similar in content, length and degree of difficulty to the actual CBEST, along with reviews and explanations of answers.

'Strategy' is a word that appears often, and the section on test taking techniques spells out the way to arrive at logical answers. Scoring and evaluation sheets show the student where improvement is needed.

Elna thinks the most comforting section of the book explains what to

expect on the fateful test day and presents a timetable of preparatory steps to meet the challenge calmly and in complete control.

An educational consultant, Elna credits her Gamma Phi Beta experience as Director of Expansion (1972-76) and Province Collegiate Director before that for preparing her for her work. "I visited and evaluated numerous campuses throughout the country, and I can tell students about these schools with more authority than I would otherwise," she said.

Elna conducts classes and individual consultations to help students choose careers, apply to colleges and prepare for SAT and GRE tests, as well as the CBEST. Her book is an attempt to reach students who are not enrolled in such




