er letterhead says "Resources for the Gifted, Inc.," but behind that title is Kathy Wonderlic Kolbe (Northwestern) whose name is followed by several titles: president and owner of Kathy Kolbe, Inc., a national learning network of educational consultants who spread the word of her products; president and owner of Resources for the Gifted, Inc., largest international publisher of materials for gifted education; chairman of the board of Think, Inc., a non-profit educational foundation that conducts research and seminars related to the learning process; partner in Quality Management Concepts, Ltd., consultants for business and professionals; consultant to schools, state departments of education and national educational organizations; and career counselor to aspiring women in business and the professions.

Kathy wears other hats, too. She is a specialist in the design of educational materials, author or coauthor of 27 educational books and "manipulatives" designed to develop critical and creative thinking skills, and editor of 108 educational books to teach students in pre-school through university levels.

Her enterprises, about to celebrate their 10th anniversary, have taken an astounding leap from a small

mimeographed order form business she operated from a bedroom closet to a \$3.5 million concern in a Phoenix office building she owns. Kathy employs a full time staff of 30 and oversees a worldwide network of writers, artists and educators who come up with ideas to challenge critical and creative thinking for youngsters in more than 30,000 classrooms throughout the country. Now, through her Kathy Kolbe, Inc. Learning Network, hundreds of teachers are finding supplementary careers as independent business people who spread the word to public and private schools, libraries, hospitals, camps, educational conferences and neighborhood parent groups.

Getting back to Resources for the Gifted and its "Think-ercises"—What is a Think-ercise? According to Kathy, they can help children reach a higher level of thinking. Publications offer youngsters practice in meeting challenges head on. "I write activities that cause students to go back and forth between the left-brain, logical, critical thinking approach, and the right-brain, intuitive or creative track. With our non-threatening exercises, youngsters can try techniques that build on their intellectual strengths."

She tries to give students intellectual challenges, to build their self-image, learn how to solve problems and to think both critically and creatively. Her approaches vary: activity books that get children actively involved in the process; games, some competitive, some non-competitive; learning center materials; hands-on construction sets; and kits to be used either at home or school. Kathy said, "Think-ercises reinforce all the basic skills, because children find they're a necessary ingredient for problem solving. To plan a campaign to protect 'Nessie,' the Loch Ness monster, children will need to learn geography, history—even international law!"

In addition, Think-ercises stress multi-sensory techniques. Children can build with recycled objects like cogs, sprockets, music box innards, fabric and other odds and ends scavanged from a variety of manufacturers. Each box of industrial remnants is different. All are hand assembled.

Kathy's concept also includes the vital sharing of findings. "Once a child has discovered a truth, he must communicate. A brilliant mind is caged if it cannot communicate. Think-ercises get children writing, taping, drawing and/or acting to give them practice in communicating ideas."

Kathy credits her two gifted children for getting her started in the business. They were not being challenged by their public school system and when she approached the school district as a frustrated parent, she was told she could head a committee to start a gifted program. She found little to read on the subject, so she spent a year interviewing parents, students,

educators and psychologists. Before starting to implement her own ideas and concepts, Kathy set up a test summer school for 200 children each summer for five years. It was so successful that without formal training as an educator she taught graduate level courses in the subject at Arizona State University. At the same time she started the State Association for the Gifted and Talented.

Kathy took \$500 earned from teaching seminars and put it into the "inventory," purchasing the few available games and other materials for the gifted (defined as one with an I.Q. of more than 130). At first customers came to her house with mimeographed

order sheets and Kathy filled orders from the bedroom closet. As orders multiplied, she added a shed to her home and later enclosed a carport to make another storeroom-office. Between 1975 and 1979 she had accumulated enough money to send out her first mail order catalog to 3,500 parents and teachers who had attended her classes and seminars. The response rate was so good that she knew she had discovered a tremendous need.


She found a printer who would give her extended time to pay bills, allowing her to sell books before she had to pay for the printing. The key to her success in those early years: "Keep your overhead low. I was profitable from the start because I didn't rush out and buy new office furniture or rent a fancy office when the orders started coming in." Her tools were the kitchen table for writing books and creating games, a family ping pong table for shipping, a seed bin for storing inventory and the bathroom scale for weighing materials for mailing. Later, when forced to expand from her home, Kathy went to a bank and secured a line of credit enabling her to buy a building.

The second force encouraging her in her business enterprise was her own handicap, dyslexia and dysgraphia. She sees and writes everything backwards to the extent that it took her a year to learn how to write her name. But, she was gifted, and with her father's encouragement and reinforcement that she was special, Kathy persevered, learning how to read in third grade. Her survival technique was learning how to speed read and she can still write backwards as fast as she can write frontwards. To her, having a learning disability was a challenge. Right answers often looked wrong, so she was forced to analyze alternatives, synthesize different methods and evaluate each step along the way. "Lucky me," Kathy said, "I had to be creative. I couldn't just memorize and follow instructions."

Kathy has been honored as Arizona's Small Business Person of the Year by the Small Business Administration and represented her state at a ceremony in the White House Rose Garden—a fitting spot for a person whose survival skill while living at a frenetic pace is to have something totally relaxing, totally different, to do. In her case, this is gardening. "I work in my garden 18 to 20 hours a week. During that time business is never on my mind."

ГФВ's financial structure

Alumnae taxes . . . Opportunity Fund donations . . . Foundation gifts.

Three kinds of gifts for one Sorority? Are they differ-

ent? Is it necessary to contribute to all?

Gamma Phi Beta's financial structure can be compared to a coin. On one side is the General Fund and on the other is the Foundation. Each fund exists in order to comply with U.S. Internal Revenue Service regulations governing gifts to not-for-profit corporations.

The General Fund is funded primarily by collegiate and materials fees, alumnae taxes and Opportunity fund gifts. It finances the programming, growth and day-to-day operation of the Sorority. In part, the General Fund is

used:

—to pay the salaries and travel expenses of eight Collegiate Consultants and Extension Supervisors during the 1985-86 school year;

—to establish eight new collegiate chapters and 21 alum-

nae groups in the past two years;

—to develop programming for members and chapters (SisterLink, International Rush Consultant program);

—to write and revise publications and manuals (*Gamma Phi Beta History 1874-1984*, the "Advisor's Advisor" newsletter for collegiate chapter advisors);

—to pay the expenses of more than 100 sisters who volunteer their time as international officers;

—to publish quarterly THE CRESCENT, the Sorority magazine every member receives for life;

—to partially fund the biennial International Convention;

—to cover Central Office operating expenses.

Payment of the alumnae tax is the most basic way an alumna can honor her lifelong commitment to Gamma Phi Beta. It is a responsibility of membership and should be accepted by all alumnae. Alumnae taxes ensure that the Gamma Phi Beta experience will be available to our younger sisters, both today and tomorrow. Alumnae taxes keep Gamma Phi Beta alive!

But it is gifts to the Opportunity Fund that help Gamma Phi Beta thrive! The Opportunity Fund was started in 1980 to attract gifts from alumnae who want to do more than simply pay their alumnae tax. Gifts to the Opportunity Fund mean the difference between just keeping up and moving ahead, between being a follower and being a leader. Opportunity Fund gifts ensure that Gamma Phi Beta's reputation for excellence will be enhanced.

In early fall, each alumna receives the Opportunity Fund mailer. For those living where there is an alumnae group, it is a reminder to pay their alumnae tax, along

with local dues, through the local chapter. Those alumnae are encouraged also to support Gamma Phi Beta's programs and services by making a direct contribution to the Opportunity Fund.

For alumnae living in areas without an alumnae group, the Opportunity Fund mailer is their opportunity to demonstrate their loyalty and pride in Gamma Phi Beta and its programs. The first \$12 of each gift is credited as the alumnae tax; the rest of the contribution is

considered an Opportunity Fund donation.

The other side of the Gamma Phi Beta coin is the Foundation. It was incorporated in 1959 to fulfill the educational and philanthropic aims of the Sorority. Under the U.S. Internal Revenue code, gifts to the Foundation are tax deductible.

The Foundation is supported by endowments, bequests and gifts from members and chapters. In November, the Foundation begins its annual campaign for gifts by contacting all alumnae. It follows up with

reminders in February and April.

The Sorority's financial aid program consists of scholarships, fellowships and grants-in-aid. Last year, 12 scholarships and 10 fellowships totalling \$29,100 were awarded to deserving sisters. Foundation gifts are also used to fund educational programs, such as Personal and Chapter Enrichment (PACE) packets. These programs are available to Gamma Phi Beta members through their chapters, THE CRESCENT and at International Convention.

Gifts to the Foundation also support the sorority's international philanthropy, camping for "special girls." Gifts from across the continent provide memorable and enriching experiences for girls at Camp Sechelt, the Sorority's internationally owned and operated camp in Vancouver, British Columbia. Last year 109 special girls from the Vancouver area enjoyed the benefit of camping under the loving guidance of Gamma Phi Beta volunteer camp counselors and camp staff.

Also, funds are returned directly to communities where there are collegiate and alumnae chapters who have requested funds to add to their local camping related gifts. Last year 30 chapters received \$8,330 to

help 162 girls attend 36 local camps.

The two sides of the Gamma Phi Beta coin—the General Fund and the Foundation—support different facets of Gamma Phi Beta. Each is necessary to realize the ideals and purposes of Gamma Phi Beta. Each depends on YOU!





i Chapter, University of Idaho, celebrated its 75th anniversary in February. The first sorority on campus, it began in 1901 as a sewing club which met in the Moscow City Hall furnace room. The club developed into a strong group that became Xi Chapter on November 22, 1909.

More than 160 members returned to Moscow for the weekend celebration. In attendance were Helen McConnel Hoff (class of 1928), Agnes Ramstedt Hawkins (class of 1932) and Susan Malcolm Frazier (class of 1933). Mrs. Hawkins's granddaughter, Nancy, is a Xi Chapter collegian.

What Miss Hoff and Mrs. Frazier noticed is the change in the behavior and aspirations of women students. "The girls all seem so independent, free and happy," said Mrs. Hoff. The anniversary weekend began with a Friday evening open house complete with peanuts and olives and old yearbooks. Alumnae were then treated to a slide show accompanied by speeches and singing. Gamma Rho returns

hen a University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh local sorority petitioned Gamma Phi Beta last fall, it was the first step toward the rechartering of Gamma Rho Chapter. Inactive since 1976 (all sororities and fraternities had left campus by the late 1970s because of limited student interest), Gamma Phi Beta is the first sorority to return to campus. Three fraternities also have returned.

Soon after pledging, colony members earned third place in the university's Winter Carnival. They also participated in a campus blood drive and helped raise funds for the American Heart Association. Social functions were held with fraternities and the colony co-sponsored the All-Greek Spring Formal.

On April 27, 1985, 37 new members of Gamma Rho Chapter were initiated at a local chapel. That evening, the new initiates and their friends and families gathered at a banquet to celebrate the rechartering of the chapter.

The Outstanding. Pledge Award was presented to Kelly Walsh, colony president. Chapter advisors and Extension Supervisor Brooke Bailey (Cal.-Santa Barbara) received gifts of appreciation. Gamma Rhoreceived the silver tea service and baby cup which had

been presented to the chapter at its 1966 chartering. Problem Solving

magine attending a meeting where the main purpose is to deal with some significant challenges. Imagine further that the meeting is productive, creative and even renewing—that the challenges are constructively addressed and solutions reached. A chapter that chooses to follow an organized system of problem solving can deal with challenges in a timely, effective manner that guarantees short and long range results.

To ensure success, the leader must approach the situation with an open mind and truly want the solution to come from the group. All involved must be willing to listen and stay on task. A chalkboard or flip chart is helpful for listing ideas in clear sight of the whole group. If the group is larger than eight, it is wise to divide it and assign a leader for each small group. After working through the method in small groups, the large group may reassemble, share ideas and draw final conclusions.

A basic six step method yields the best results when each step is separately defined and specifically addressed. The leader's role is to guide the group through each step and keep members on the task at hand.

STEP ONE: Define the problem.

Don't assume that everyone knows exactly what the problem is. Define it specifically. For example, instead of saying generally, "We need to improve participation," say more specifically, "We need to increase attendance at our event."

STEP TWO: State the pertinent facts.

For this step to be effective, the group leader needs to be well informed about the problem. For example, the leader may tell the group how many invitations were sent, how many attended, the cost and location, and other facts.

STEP THREE: List advantages of solving this problem.

If there are no specific advantages to solving this problem, it is doubtful the problem as defined truly exists. The basic question here is, "How will the group and individual members benefit by solving this problem?"

STEP FOUR: List obstacles that stand in the way of solving the problem.

The group must be both thorough and honest when listing obstacles. For example, obstacles to increased participation at an event may range from relatively simple challenges, such as transportation difficulties, to more complicated challenges, such as a lack of a sense of belonging.

STEP FIVE: Suggest possible ways to overcome each obstacle.

Look at each obstacle individually and use the brainstorming approach explained in the teambuilding article on pages 24 and 25 of the spring, 1985 issue of THE CRESCENT.

STEP SIX: Decide what to do.

The processes of analysis, judgment and elimination of untenable solutions takes place only in this step. Now that the group has fully defined the problem, built a sense of common purpose, listened fully to the ideas of each member and listed possible solutions, it is ready to evaluate, analyze and reach a consensus.

A solution reached through this step-by-step method is likely to succeed because group involvement has guaranteed both a high level of awareness and a high level of commitment. This process also taps the often overlooked potential of creative thinking and the strength that is derived from a team effort.

Translating in Venezuela

Elizabeth Taylor Aguerrevere (Illinois) has used her college degree in a rewarding career as manuscript translator and editor, while working as an executive secretary for an international company in Caracas, Venezuela.

As a Spanish major who minored in English and Portuguese, Elizabeth first took her language skills to the Organization of American States in Washington, D.C., where she translated a book on Brazilian music from Portuguese to English.

Three other translations have been done in Caracas, her home for the past 30 years. At the request of author Luis Vallenilla, she improved a poor English translation of his book, Oil, the Making of a New Economic Order. The second translation was more ambitious, a 600 page biography of Simon Bolivar, The Liberator.

The philosophy of Beverly Stein Kievman (Rollins), named one of Georgia's Five Most Influential Women, is "If you want something, go for it. Believe in yourself and you can have whatever you want, and you can do whatever you want to do."

Beverly parlayed this philosophy into a multimillion dollar business, Marketing Innovations Corp., an Atlanta firm that helps women in sales related areas. What she tries to do is bring out the latent abilities in people. "I teach a woman to be herself when she's dealing with powerful people," Beverly said. A woman's number one problem is how far to push before she has pushed too far. "I teach them if gut feeling tells you to do something, do it. If you go too far, laugh at yourself."

One of her products is a sales seminar, which she teaches to men and women across the country. The seminar led to publication of her first book, *The Complete Success Workbook for Today's Saleswoman*, published by Prentice-Hall after three rejections.

Beverly started her first business

20 years ago. Resigning as company president after 10 years, she started a public relations consulting firm that specialized in promoting the state of Georgia in the motion picture industry. For three years she traveled to New York and California selling her state, and then switched gears by answering a newspaper ad for a salesman. After a year with Research Institute of America selling business services to corporations, she found herself number one in new business development competing against 97 male district managers. She was promoted to regional sales manager, and left the company to form Marketing Innovations in 1979

Beverly handles a full professional life by balancing it with travel, tennis and civic activities—the latter satisfying her need to contribute to the community and make professional contacts that are invaluable to working women. A founder of the Women's Commerce Club, she is the only woman on the National Bank of Georgia board, serves on the boards of four other companies, and is past president of the Leuke-
