Last spring four outstanding college Panhellenic associations earned special recognition from Gamma Phi Beta. They were the first to receive the Gamma Phi Beta Panhellenic Public Relations Award, which will be given annually.

Awards were presented to University of Illinois, Auburn University, University of California-Irvine and Lehigh University College Panhellenics.

Established to recognize the successful planning and implementation of a public relations program which positively enhances the Greek image, one award was presented at each of the four regional Panhellenic meetings. An application form was sent to all college panhellenic presidents, encouraging them to apply for the award. Winners received a plaque and \$250, and were announced at the regional meetings.

The University of Illinois Panhellenic Association received its award at the Mid-American Panhellenic Association Conference meeting for sponsoring two programs: an all-campus activities workshop, at which representatives of many campus groups spoke, and

an ongoing program entitled Campus Achievers, which honors one student, who has been nominated by his or her campus organization, each month.

Professor's Night Out earned the Auburn University Panhellenic Association an award. It was presented at the Southeastern Panhellenic Association Conference meeting. Professor's Night Out is a free child care service for children of faculty and staff, complete with toys, games and refreshments.

The Western Regional Greek Conference winner was the University of California-Irvine for its Greeks of the 90s seminar. Informed presenters and workshop discussion were the highlights of this program which focused on current issues of concern to Greeks.

A benefit raffle for California earthquake disaster victims won the award for the Lehigh University Panhellenic Association. It was presented at the Northeastern Panhellenic Association Conference meeting. After hearing about the earthquake, the Panhellenic quickly contacted the Red Cross to enlist its support and then organized the successful fundraiser.

ELEBRATE! As a finale to Convention 1990 on Saturday, July 28, Gamma Phi Betas from across the continent joined together in Denver to SHARE THE PRIDE and CELEBRATE the success of the Capital Endowment Campaign and the future of Gamma Phi Beta.

With the 1988 Convention "Spirit Song" playing in the background and balloons falling from the ceiling, Campaign General Chairman Ardis McBroom Marek (Northwestern) presented an \$817,000 check to Foundation Chairman Ann Mul-

len Bronsing (Indiana St.) to establish a leadership development endowment within the Foundation. Ardis then presented a shovel to International President Randall Stevens (Calif.-Long Beach) to break ground later that afternoon for a Sorority-owned International Headquarters facility.

The CELEBRATION began when major Campaign donors were honored at a reception hosted by the Campaign Steering and Major Donor Committees. Campaign Executive Chairman Karen



Karen, who served as mistress of ceremonies, began the program by introducing Ardis Marek; Steering Committee members Ann Bronsing, Phyllis Donaldson Choat (Nebraska), Sally Erikson Lewis (Bradley), Marjory Mills Shupert (Colorado St.), Randall Stevens, Jolene Lessard Stiver (N. Dakota St.) and Karen Gamel Urette (Oklahoma); and Major Donor Committee members Linda Brooks Drevno (Calif.-Berkeley), Linda Hallenbeck Pelegrino (Calif. St.-Long Beach), L'Cena Brunskill Rice (USC) and Barbara Missert Wessel (Syracuse).

After lunch, organizational consultant Kay Sprinkel Grace, who was initiated into Gamma Phi Beta at the 1990 Convention, spoke on leadership. In her speech entitled, "Where Do the Mermaids Stand?" from Robert Fulghum's *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*, she asked Gamma Phi Betas to stand out from the others—to commit to a life of fulfillment and service, to accept the leadership imperative and to value their Gamma Phi Beta affiliation as it manifests itself in their lives.

The CELEBRATION continued as individuals and chapters were honored for SHARING THEIR PRIDE. (See page six for listing of donors.) For gifts of \$1,000 or more, silver Revere bowls were



awarded to individuals, collegiate chapters and house corporations; certificates were awarded to alumnae chapters.

The climax came as the results of the Campaign were announced, and Gamma Phi Betas from coast to coast stood to CELEBRATE and SHARE THE PRIDE!



Atending alumnae chapter meetings meant an hour drive each way for Judy. Becoming active in the Syracuse Alumnae Chapter meant carving time from her already busy schedule—precious time away from her children and fledgling practice as a speech language pathologist. SisterLink was just being introduced to the Sorority and Judy accepted the position of Syracuse SisterLink chairman. Judy had instinctively recognized that dealing effectively with her new situation included reaching out to others, establishing new life patterns and capitalizing on her connections.

No one ever plans to divorce. We marry and our lives are full of hope and promise. Then things go awry. Many women have been conditioned by families and society to accept roles as caretakers and nurturers. We assume the responsibility for making a marriage work. For us divorce can be devastating. Not only do we deal with a very major loss but we see ourselves as failures. How many women remain in unhappy marriages because they perceive divorce as the most public admission of failure?

No one seeks divorce any more than anyone seeks to be widowed, but divorce and widowhood have much in common. The divorced woman endures the same sense of loss and period of mourning, the aloneness and loneliness (they are not the same), the stress of adjustment and the reduced financial circumstances that the widow does.

Today, 50 percent of marriages end in divorce. That statistic, however, masks the effort that was

expended in trying to make these failed marriages successful. The statistic does not tell of the early happy years and never-to-be-forgotten memories; nor does it reveal the number of people existing in unhappy marriages. Money—or the lack of it—

is commonly cited as a reason for the failure of a marriage. Money and financial security are also a motive for remaining in a marriage. The husband is loath to relinquish a portion of the estate that has been accumulated; the wife settles for financial security rather than a rewarding relationship. Shortly after my impending divorce became public knowledge, a very visible and highly respected woman in my community told me that there were many who were envious of me. As I looked at her puzzled, she said, "You have had the courage to do what many of us cannot."

I do not advocate divorce nor do I recommend that anyone approach it without the most serious consideration. The decision to sever the family unit is an awesome one. The woman considering divorce must recognize the fact that no matter what her age, statistics show that she will face her remaining years alone. To anyone contemplating divorce I suggest that they consider which is preferable: life as it is with your husband or being alone on every birthday and holiday to come. I am discussing divorce here because I hope to encourage those who do divorce to see it as an opportunity. It offers an opportunity to grow, to become a new person, to stretch and challenge oneself. I am a very different person today than the unhappy suburban housewife of five years ago. I am truly happy and fulfilled and, like Judy Swanson, found a wealth of support and resources available to me in Gamma Phi Beta.


The positions we held as officers and chairmen in our collegiate and alumnae chapters have given us opportunities to assess situations, prioritize needs, establish goals and define objectives. These are basic leadership techniques which have application in all facets of our lives. In divorce and the successful reconstruction of one's life, there is an implicit mandate to take a leadership role in determining one's future.

For many of us one of the most difficult things to do is to take risks. For many women, deciding to divorce is the most momentous risk they will ever take. People tend to stay in unhappy situations because they fear the unknown. Unconsciously they prefer to deal with the familiar no matter how inappropriate it may be because they have established a pattern of survival. It takes tremendous courage to break away from the familiar even when intellectually one knows the wisdom in so doing. It takes support from family and friends to encourage one in the times of doubt, misgiving and sorrow that follow.

Having taken that first major risk in divorcing, it is crucial to establish a pattern of risk taking if one is to take charge of one's life. Opportunities

for taking other risks will follow. There are the risks involved in finding a job or changing positions or careers. There are the risks of relocating the family and finding a new support network (schools, doctors, attorneys and even hair stylists!). There is the risk of being able to adjust to a new life. Perhaps most personal of all are the risks of reaching out to new friends.


As we grow we learn to deal with guilt and we begin to understand responsibility. We women have been marvelously trained to accept guilt. We readily accept responsibility for the problems of others. Remember, we are nurturers and caretakers. Many of us live for our families. Divorce gives us the opportunity to live for ourselves. Our challenge is to learn to do so without guilt. I am not suggesting that we neglect our families and responsibilities, but I am challenging the divorced woman to learn to respond to her own needs and priorities.

The successful divorced woman learns how not to be defensive and even more important learns that it is acceptable not to be perfect. Remember now, we are talking about the former caretaker and nurturer who once made everything perfect for everyone around her. She learns to live one day at a time. She learns that it is all right to put aside beloved and established holiday traditions and start new ones that are more meaningful and less painful than the old ones. At the risk of sounding trite, I must add that the successful divorced woman learns to be gentle with herself, learns to be understanding of herself and learns to be her own best friend.

One of the more cumbersome tasks any of us in need face is that of learning to be generous enough to allow others to help. There are times when the reaching out of others to us seems an imposition. One must learn to

examine the reasons for one's hesitancy when others offer to listen or include us in their plans. Do we hesitate because we are uncertain how to repay their kindnesses? Often people simply and sincerely want to help and to be friends. Recognize that they may need to feel that they are helping. They may need to assuage some feelings of their own. Recognize that it is not important that you repay every gesture in kind but it is important that some day you reach out of help someone else.

The successful divorced woman accepts the fact that she has assumed a very different status in her community and among her friends. Rather than being resentful she understands that except for her most intimate friends, she will see less and less of married couples. Relationships are built upon common interests and situations. It is not a lack of sensitivity that will cause former associates to drift away. Use the time you would have spent with them to

seek and cultivate single friends.

Learn to enjoy your own company and get in the habit of going places alone. You lessen the opportunity to meet new people when you are with a friend on whom your attention is focused. I am fortunate enough to live in a small city where I am well known and where I feel safe in going to concerts, movies and the stage by myself. I go to antique shows alone. I am an active volunteer and go to events alone. I go with my eyes raised to everyone else's and with a smile on my face. And I meet people!

Divorce usually means a severe change in a woman's financial status. Statistics show that a divorced man's life style is significantly enriched while the divorced woman's is reduced to as little as one-third of what it had been. The divorced woman learns to treat herself to things that are not costly and does not let a lack of disposable income keep her at home. There is nothing wrong with sitting in the last row of the concert hall or theatre. There are the intermissions in which to mingle. Find at least one cause which interests you and become involved as a volunteer. It is so important to be visible in the community and so easy at times to succumb to the urge to curl up with a book or in front of the television set at home.

I found myself needing employment after 20 years away from the workplace. I was fortunate to have had many years of alumnae experience with Gamma Phi Beta and just as many years as a volunteer fund raiser. My Sorority and fund raising experience led to a position in a small private college as director of alumni affairs and assistant director of development. I had deliberately sought a career in development because I could capitalize on vol-

unteer experience and also because I knew it would place me in a position where I would constantly meet new people. These were objectives I had defined before beginning a job search.

This article would not be complete without a discussion on finding a new man. Have you ever noticed how there seem to be so many unattached single women and a scarcity of unattached single men? It is perfectly logical to expect that for every divorced woman there has to be a divorced man, equally unattached. Right? Wrong!

While we women are busy being nurturers and caretakers we neglect to take care of ourselves as men seem instinctively to do. When a woman faces the prospect of ending a marriage, she begins to prepare. Her first concern is her family. Often she must find a job. Not until family, self and income are under control, does she look for male companionship. Men, on the

other hand, are less likely to need to focus on these priorities and have the luxury of being able to seek new relationships immediately.

The most attractive woman is the woman who has a passion, a commitment, who is involved, happy and fulfilled within herself. That passion or commitment may be to a job, a volunteer or societal cause, a hobby or sport, politics or church. The most attractive woman is the one who does not need a man to feel complete or good about herself. A woman who needs a man has yet to come to terms with herself, to genuinely like and believe in herself.

In coping with your single state, concentrate on the opportunities you have. Be patient with yourself. Allow yourself to grieve and mourn. Choose confidantes carefully. Avail yourself of all resources offered by your community, church, family, friends and Sorority. Capitalize upon the leadership talents you developed during your active years in Gamma Phi Beta and use them as you take charge of your life. Define priorities and be goal oriented. Trust your instincts, believe in yourself and do what you want to do and not what others see as the right thing for you. Proceed with grace. Make no apologies, you owe them to no one. Be positive. Consider carefully and then take risks. Concentrate, not on what might have been, but on what will be.

INTERNATIONAL COLLEGIATE BOARD

Have you ever

wondered who serves as a sounding board for International Council (formerly named Grand Council) when it considers collegiate issues and policy changes? Or who represents collegiate interests at the international level? Along with the Collegiate Vice President, these areas are carefully considered by the newly created International Collegiate Board.

The International Collegiate Board was established so that collegians would have a forum, in addition to biennial Sorority Conventions, to express their needs and concerns. It also provides the International Council an opportunity to fully explain the reasoning behind policies and decisions pertinent to collegians, and ensures good communication between the two groups. International Collegiate Board members serve, in effect, as liaisons between International Council and collegiate chapters.

The International Collegiate Board is comprised of eight collegians, each representing a geographical area. They were selected last spring through an application process and will serve a one-year term. Advisors to the group are the International President and Collegiate Vice President.

"It is important for collegians to feel the International Council is aware of their goals and concerns so our Sorority can remain strong," said Elizabeth Dupuis (Illinois), a member of the board.

The International Collegiate Board communicates through monthly letters, questionnaires and phone calls, and submits individual written reports to International Council before its meetings. A synopsis of the board's annual meeting, which

is held either at Convention or Leadership Training School, is sent to each collegiate chapter.

Lynn Martin: campaigning for Congress

Bright, likeable, irreverent, vibrant, confident, compassionate, well-informed, and exuding common sense, a sense of humor and boundless energy . . . all these descriptions have been applied to U.S. Representative Lynn Morley Martin (Illinois), who is a candidate for the U.S. Senate in the upcoming November election.

"She's tough, she's strong and she exemplifies

the very best in public service," President George Bush said of Lynn in talking to a group of 10,000 young people. He urged them to make Lynn a role model.

With 10 years of seniority in the House behind her, Lynn is running for the U.S. Senate because she believes that "the future is the most important issue in this campaign."

Lynn lost just one election—in eighth grade. She ran against her boyfriend for class president, and lost by one vote—the vote she sportingly cast for him! Some years later at the University of Illinois, however, she was elected to the student senate each year she attended school.

After graduating, she taught high school English, government and economics in DuPage County and then Rockford, Ill. A Republican state representative and county Democratic chairman were her neighbors, and she was often involved in political discussions.

She ran for and was elected to the Winnebago County Board in 1972, to the Illinois House of Representatives in 1976 and to the state senate in 1978. When U.S. Congressman John Anderson decided to run for president in 1980, she ran for the seat he was vacating and is now serving her fifth term in that office.

Lynn has heard someone say about her that "she is the girl next door who's become one of the boys." Actually, she is still an exception at her level of government. Thirty years ago there were only 20 women in the U.S. House of Representatives. Today, there are only 26, while only two women serve in the U.S. Senate and three have become governors.

Lynn led the successful bipartisan battle in the 100th Congress to grant congressional employees the same civil rights protection available to most American workers. In the 101st Congress, she co-chairs the Bipartisan Ethics Task Force empaneled to review the standards of conduct for lawmakers



and to consider reforms. Her three terms on the Budget Committee, two terms on the Armed Services Committee and tenure as vice chair of the House Republican Conference were capped in 1989 by assignment to the House Rules Committee.

Lynn was born and reared in Illinois. In 1987, she married U.S. District Judge Harry D. Leinenweber. Her two daughters by her first marriage are now 28 and 21. Leinenweber has five children. The family divides its time between Washington, Chicago and Rockford. Lynn enjoys weekend gardening at the couple's restored century-old home in Loves Park near Rockford.

Lynn recently described herself as "a mother, a teacher and a public servant. You're looking at a working mom," she said, "who has driven car pools, and gone from the kitchen table to the conference table."

Lynn, a former teacher, cites statistics indicating that, despite the billions of dollars the country spends on education, less than 10 percent of all American 13-year-olds are adept at reading and less than one percent are considered advanced.

She suggests improvements in seven areas to raise the level of educational achievement which "look beyond the simple 'spend more' solutions of the past: parental involvement and

empowerment; teacher accountability, performance testing and merit pay; rewards and recognition by the federal government for school, student and teacher excellence; easing the financial burden of education by legislation allowing greater deductibility of certain education expenses; drug-free schools through greater police protection and cooperation with neighborhood watch groups; making the Head Start programs, already proving successful, available to more children; workplace literacy programs provided by the private sector with federal assistance.

Environmental enforcement legislation drafted by Lynn was a part of a bill establishing a cabinet-level Department of Environmental Protection. Her amendment increases the number of professional investigators assigned to the Office of Criminal Investigations and helps the EPA catch and stop polluters. It also mandates formation of a National Enforcement Training Institute and establishes a fund, created from fines paid by polluters, to offset the cost of the legislation.

She has consistently supported legislation for cleaner air, at the same time fighting for restoring a federal tax credit for utilities and industries that install air and water pollution

control equipment. "The credit makes sense," says Lynn. "It would help hold down utility costs, help create clean-coal technology jobs, ensure markets for Illinois coal and protect the jobs of Illinois miners."

Lynn puts everything she's got into her job. In announcing her candidacy for the U.S. Senate, she said, "I've come to ask for your help. Will you lend me your hands and stand by my side in the days ahead?"
